

A world in which chemicals are no longer produced or used in ways that harm human health and the environment



Project period: 2014- 2017

- Funded by the Global Environment Facility;
 Implemented by UN Environment; Executed by IPEN
- 4 Focus Countries: Cameroon, Cote D'Ivoire, Ethiopia, Tanzania

Aim: To minimize and ultimately eliminate the manufacture, import, sale and use of decorative lead paints in the focus countries

To minimize and ultimately eliminate the manufacture, import, sale and use of decorative lead paints in participating focus countries










The Lead Paint Elimination Project in Africa
