Outlooks – Innovations for Systemic Transformation and Governance

Some Innovative features of the sixth edition of the Global Environment Outlook

- Building on regional outlooks – more focus on solutions in the **Policy & Outlooks chapters (2/3 of the report)**
- Including **equity, gender and economic** aspects in a more systematic way
- Looking more at **'systems'** and **'systemic policies'** as opposed to single issues
- More emphasis on **Policy Effectiveness** with **concrete examples & advice for member states**
- Innovation and systemic transformation underpinning the **Outlooks chapters** = bottom-up (seeds of change) + top-down (scenarios)

Cost Elements	Budget (USD)
Workforce	815,000
Meetings	993,000
Quality Control	150,000
Publishing & Translations	360,000
Communications & Outreach	330,000
GEO-7 Scoping Study	40,000
Total	2,688,000

Take-away Messages

- Progress is well on track for a successful completion of the process
- Major efforts ongoing, internally and externally, to mobilize the required core resources
- However, a significant funding gap is still there
