






RECALLING THE OUTCOMES AND PROGRESS MADE POST ADDIS ABABA WORKSHOP

East Africa Sub-regional Workshop on the Establishment of Legal Limits on Lead in Paint and GEF UNEP/IPEN Regional Lead Paint Elimination Project in Africa Workshop

- The East Africa Sub-regional Workshop on the Establishment of Legal Limits on Lead in Paint took place on 2-3 December 2015.
- The workshop was back to back with the GEF UNEP/IPEN Regional Lead Paint Elimination Project in Africa Workshop, 4 December 2015.









Objectives included:

- Provide governments and other key stakeholders with the necessary tools and information, including the Lead Paint Alliance's toolkit, to take further steps at the national level to establish and implement regulatory frameworks on lead paint.
- Share information on existing regulatory frameworks and progress in lead paint elimination.









Participants

- Government officials and stakeholders from 15 African countries: Benin, Burundi, Cameroon, Cote d'Ivoire, Democratic Republic of Congo, Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Malawi, Nigeria, Rwanda, Sudan, Tanzania, Uganda and Zambia.
- Experts from the United States of America, GEF, UNEP, UNIDO, WHO, IPEN and other organizations

OUTCOMES

- The Ministry of Environment,
 Forest and Climate Change of
 Ethiopia announced the
 establishment of a 90 ppm
 standard developed with
 recommendations from the
 Ethiopian Standards Agency.
- Laws to Control the Use of Lead in Paint was presented by the Chair of the Advisory Group for the Global Alliance to Eliminate Lead Paint.

- Opportunities for regional harmonization and cooperation were identified through subregional standards of the East African Community and Economic Community of West African States.
- Participants agreed that efforts are needed in each country to phase out lead paint and set a total lead content limit to 90 ppm.


