

Draft Outline Document for the Ministerial Outcome Document of the 2019 UN Environment Assembly.

As the current President of Haiti Cholera Research Funding Foundation Inc., our non-profit organization has implemented policies that have focused on fresh solutions to environmental challenges that have aimed at building sustainable societies and reducing pollution. Our foundation has engaged the citizens living in Haiti by providing environmental education in regards to sanitation with respect to water and hygiene. We currently have a memorandum of understanding with two schools in Haiti and the Solid Waste Authority in Palm Beach County Florida involving the WASH program (water, sanitation & hygiene). This effort targets **Main priority 2** of enhancing ecosystem resilience by our recycle, trash, wash and soil campaign by approximately 600 students in the city of Carefour, Haiti.

Our foundation also supports **Main priority 3** of ensuring access to environmental education and innovative approaches in education. We have been teaching the 3 R's of the environment, namely reduce, reuse and recycle. In November 2018 we will start a new program in Haiti called Say No to Plastic, which will target plastic bags, straws, coffee stirrers, soda and water bottles.

Our foundation would like to develop a partnership for implementing the vision and priorities of the 2019 UN Environment Assembly. Our main focus continues to center around eliminating the deadly disease of cholera, which still represents a major environmental challenge involving the handling of water and also personal hygiene. We could seriously benefit from **Main priority 1** with data collection and digital solutions as we look for efficient ways to gather and share information from our field workers in remote villages in Haiti.

I look forward to working with you for the goal of developing a on-going partnership with the Environment Assembly.
