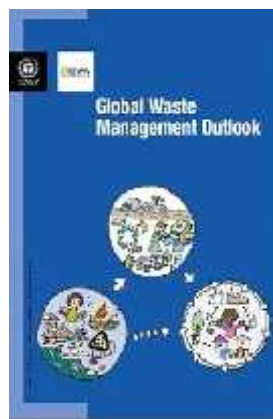

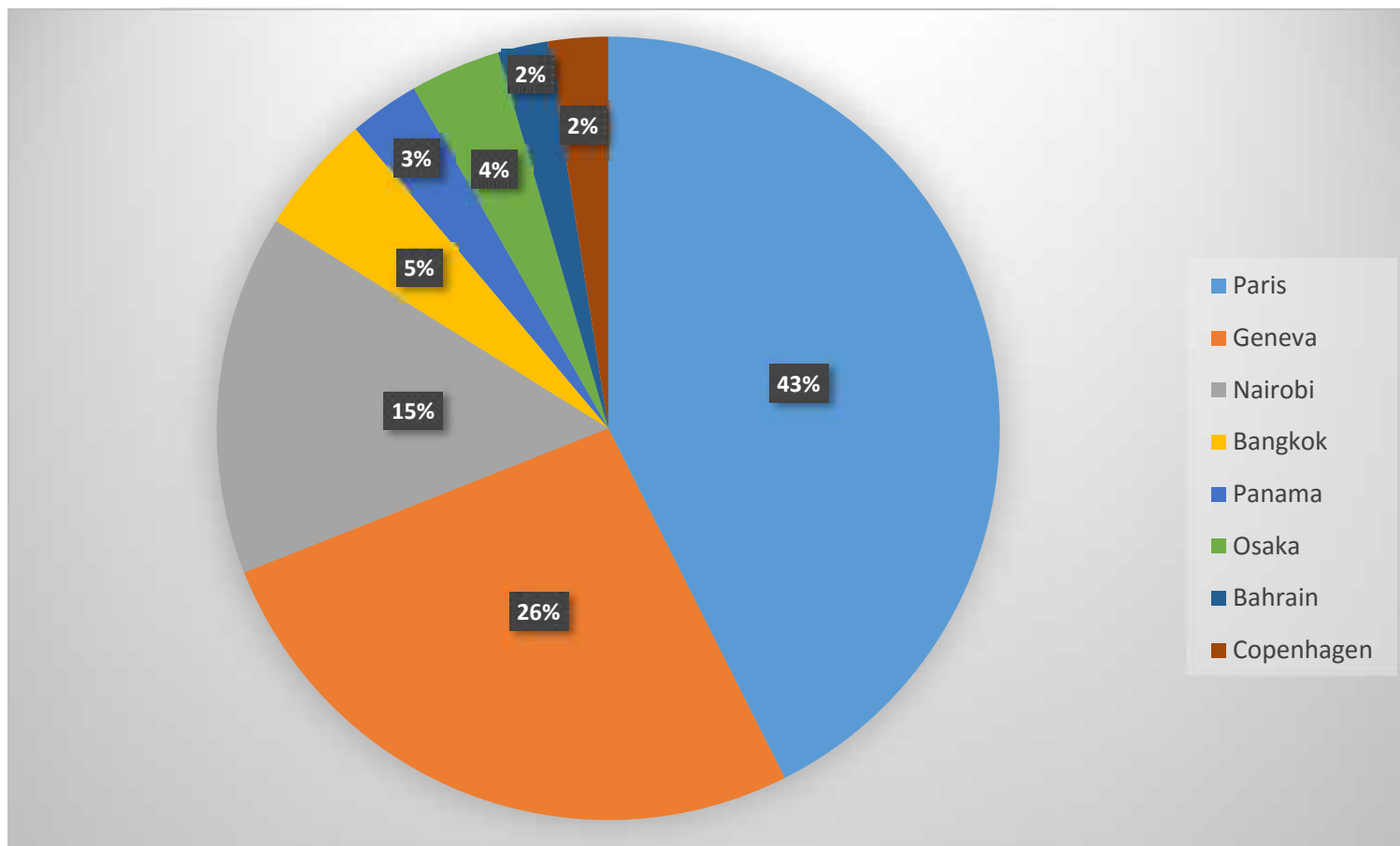

Distributed across 8 duty stations

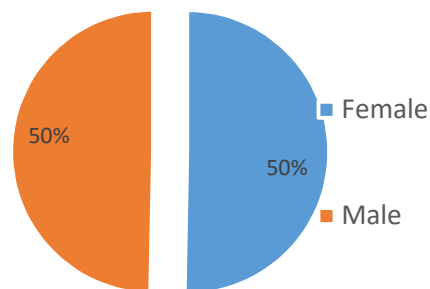


Who we are

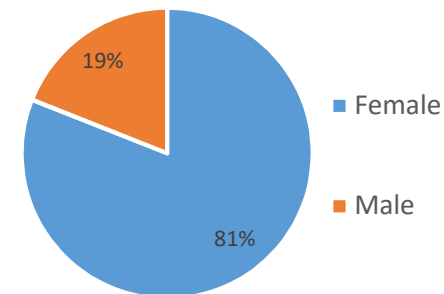
- Developed/developing country ratio 51:49 (all staff members)
- P3-P5 level -- 46% from developing countries
- Management level -- 40% from developing countries
- Management level -- 20% female

The distribution of active staff by level within the Economy Division is as follows: 10 Director level posts (2 female staff, 8 male staff), 152 Professional level posts (79 female staff, 73 male staff) and 79 General Service level posts (64 female staff, 15 male staff).

Funding

Overall Distribution by Funding Source

- 90.78% raised from extrabudgetary resources (e.g., project funds, trust funds, Global Environment Facility, Multi-Lateral Funds, etc.)
- 8.17% Environment Fund
- 0.9% Overhead Trust Account
- 0.15% Regular Budget

Fund Distribution by Sub-programme

- 51% Climate Change
- 28% Chemicals, Waste & Air Quality
- 18% Resource Efficiency
- 2% Ecosystems Management
- 1% combination of the other Sub-programmes
