Law on chemicals

Based on the following EU legislation:

- Regulation 1907/2006 registration, evaluation, authorisation and restrictions of chemicals (REACH)
- Regulation 1272/2008 classification, labelling and packaging of substances and mixtures (CLP)

Toys	Limit value set
Packaging for general use products	Limit value set
Cigarette paper	Limit value set
Condoms	Limit value set
Matherials that come into contact with food	Limit value set
Dishes, eating utensils, packaging	Limit value set

LEAD POISONING PREVENTION WEEK OF ACTION, 26-31 Oct 2015













RESULTS of tests:

- By the end of september 2015, 130 samples of different general use products were tested on lead and all were in compliance with the legislation in place.
- During the *Lead Poisoning Prevention Week of Action*, Oct 2015, Republic Inspectorate has randomly chosen and tested 30 different products (mainly toys and dishes, as well as lip gloss and cosmetics for childre) and all were in compliance with the legislation in place.
