

Ebafosa Buganda Kingdom Cassava Initiative



- Joint efforts to widely promote EBA practices led to zeroing on cassava as a critical intervention crop for clean energy, climate smart for agro industrialization
- Several meetings with Kingdom government ministers and officials
- Establishment of the EBAFOSA/BUGANDA Sentema Agro industrialization Complex in Busiro County



Ebafosa Buganda Kingdom Cassava Initiative



- These joint efforts best exemplified in Kyaggwe county established 25 acres multiplication block farm linking to farmers in other parts of the Kingdom to quality seed and clean energy and agriculture smart approaches
- The use of solar dryers as a smart climate action fabricated using locally available materials by the EBAFOSA Innovative Volunteerism AYAIAcademy



Ebafosa Buganda Kingdom Cassava Initiative



- Solar dryers promoted through innovative financing facility linking farmers savings groups to micro finance facilities
- Better quality and quantity cassava flour and saved post harvest losses.
- More earnings enables farmers to save and purchase tools to realize improved performance towards smarter practice

Buganda Cassava Initiative



- Multiplication garden of 20 acres ongoing in Sentema, Busiro county
- Additional 10 acres for youth and 25 acres in Ngogwe Kyaggwe County ongoing
- With a multiplication crop of 55 acres EBAFOSA in collaboration with Buganda Kingdom we have high quality cassava planting materials to supply the 18 counties of the Kingdom within 2020

AGRO INDUSTRIALIZATION CASSAVA



 In agreement with Buganda Kingdom, **Uganda Breweries, Uganda National** Planning Authority, the Uganda Bureau of Standards, and other stakeholders to continue with the developing cassava as a high value industrial crop that will contribute to the development of the country and accelerate Climate Action and **Agro-Industralization**



VALUE ADDITION CHALLENGES



- Value addition in agriculture production is critical
- However no transformational action has been embarked on to complete the value chain
- The deliberate seamless building of a complete value chain from crop production to exportable products is absent. Disjointed efforts in place



Overcoming Ongoing Challenges



- Building Coalition of willing Allied Forces against Hunger, poverty, malnutrition
- Bringing the activities of EBAFOSA Uganda to the attention of the national development plans. The agro industrialization drive is the centre indeed heart of the National Plan Three which becomes operational; 2020
- The EBAFOSA developed standards are being adopted as a Uganda National Compliance Standards document to guide the country on standards compliance



Joining the dots to fill the gaps



- Noted the need to join the various players from the grassroots to the top of the value chain to the export consumption products within the country, regionally and to several Africa countries
- This in particular needs careful intentional building by exploiting existing opportunities within the country to fill the gaps. The Buganda kingdom has been an important entry point using well established traditional social and cultural governance systems in place.



OPPORTUNITIES



- The Policy task force work started with the National Planning Authority will play a critical contribution to National Plan Three for Uganda
- Standards Compliance documentation now awaiting approval by the UNBS will enable promotion of high quality products to the African market and beyond
- EBA and amalgamations with the on-going initiative with Buganda Kingdom provides an opportunity for expansion of the model to other parts of the country



Cassava Value Chain Buganda focus



- Farmers brought together to access high value planting materials in large amounts. Initial value chain starts here with cuttings and use of solar irrigation pumps (clean energy)
- Farmers availed technologies to add value to crop as primary processors. Using solar driers enables production of high quality cassava flour that goes on to the next value chain player
- Use of clean energy in drying cassava is a first step value addition. The secondary processors in the value chain make various products to the growing local national market.



Cassava Value Chain Buganda focus2



- Secondary processors in Buganda are the beer breweries with an assured market in agreements reached between the Uganda breweries and Buganda Kingdom to make Engule (Crown) brand
- Several other big players in the industrialization drive are showing interest including pharmaceutical, bakeries and others
- EBAFOSA intentionally building the value chain linkages using the five pillars is very significant



Cassava Value Chain Buganda focus



- Sentema Agro Industrialization Centre plus the National Task Force ensuring the coherence of the various policies as well as harmonizing and synchronizing policies, laws and agreements for a smooth actualization of agro industrialization is very important.
- EBAFOSA remains a key player is the process it started in the EBA practices, Standards Compliance, Policy harmonization and the innovative financing processes.
