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#### 1. Introduction

The implementation plan of EcAp MED III was updated to take into account the progress of the Project – described in the Project Report (UNEP/MED WG.525/2) – since its first Steering Committee meeting. This document summarises the activities of EcAp MED III expected to be implemented with a modified timeline in the period July 2022 - August 2023 (section 2.) and subsequently presents an updated workplan (section 3.). The objective of this Report is to inform the donor and to support the oversight of the Project execution and the related strategic guidance of its second Steering Committee meeting.

#### 2. Revised Deadlines

In this section, details are given on changes and revised deadlines from the workplan of the first Steering Committee meeting for the activities expected to be performed during the period July 2022 – August 2023, i.e., until the scheduled end date of the project.
