- safeguard human health and conserve marine ecosystems
- when practicable, restore marine areas



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



Protecting species and habitats – MPAs

- Deep-sea sponge aggregations
- Intertidal Mytilus edulis beds on mixed and sandy sediments
- Intertidal mudflats
- Littoral chalk communities
- Lophelia pertusa reefs
- ★ Maerl beds

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- Modiolus modiolus horse mussel beds
- Oceanic ridges with hydrothermal vents/fields
- ★ Ostrea edulis beds
- Sabellaria spinulosa reefs
- Sea-pen and burrowing megafauna communities
- Seamounts
- Zostera beds










Cooperation – Using common sources of advice: International Council for the Exploration of the Sea




Mid-Atlantic Ridge Proposed EBSA



Charlie-Gibbs Fracture Zone Proposed EBSA




Collective arrangement




