





Turning the tide ... norm reform

A multilateral initiative to prevent the degradation of the marine environment from land-based activities by facilitating the realization of the duty of States to preserve and protect the marine environment.

Through the GPA, States commit "To develop comprehensive, continuing and adaptive programmes of action within a framework of integrated coastal area management".







Turning the tide ... norm reform


The GPA is also a commitment by regional and international organisations to cooperate at regional and global scales **to support national action** aimed at protecting the marine environment.

Regional Seas have negotiated legally-binding conventions/protocols and action plans that contribute to and/or parallel the objectives of the GPA

Turning the tide



Regional and international cooperation facilitate and support comprehensive, continuing and adaptive national action that builds enduring wealth



Mainstreaming the GPA into national planning and budgetary processes requires a <u>tailored approach</u>

What is the role of the Regional Seas in mainstreaming the GPA?

MCEB in Nairobi

- Reinvigorating the profile of the GPA as a multilateral initiative addressing ecosystem management at the interface of land and ocean, and positioning the GPA as a mechanism to build resilience to climate change in coastal areas;
- Improving the GPA-related decision / planning support tools available to governments and regional organisations

MCEB in Nairobi


- Making the case for mainstreaming the GPA including pilots in specific countries
- Collaborative leadership to develop and communicate the 'foundations' for national action on the following GPA categories:
 - Nutrients (links with sediment mobilization)
 - Wastewater management
 - Physical alteration and destruction of habitat
 - Marine litter

MCEB in Nairobi

- Monitoring, coordinating and reporting on:
 - the activities of the respective UNEP Divisions and Offices;
 - the activities of governments, stakeholders and UNEP's partners;
- Charting a course for the improvement of the GPA and the 3rd Intergovernmental Review


