Because indigenous peoples live close to nature, and are dependent upon natural resources for their livelihoods, chemicals and waste affect them. The consultative process on financing options for chemicals and waste consider financing for the Strategic Approach for International Chemicals Management is under consideration, and we have found this program very useful because it deals with projects on the ground. We understand that longer-term financing is under consideration but that funds are required in the short term for SAICM. We therefore make a plea to ensure that the value program for SAICM continues to receive funds in the short-term to enable it to continue in its work which is of such importance to us.
