







## Earth Civil Society Forum

## "Greater Access to Environmental and Societal Information"

December 11, 2011

Crowne Plaza Hotel, Yas Island, Abu Dhabi, UAE

**BACKGROUND:** The Eye on Earth Summit will be preceded by a Civil Society Forum (CSF) on December 11, 2011. The rationale for holding the Civil Society Forum is rooted in the fact that Major Groups and Stakeholders of civil society play an important role as an information source, an information interface with the general public and public authorities, a recipient of information, and a participant in decision making processes. They often use most of the available environmental information in their daily work and have an interest in comprehensive, reliable and adequate information and thus they constitute as representatives of the public and key decision makers, the most important recipient of environmental information.

**AIM:** The purpose of the CSF is to provide an opportunity for up to 150 Civil Society representatives from all Major Groups and regions to prepare and consolidate their inputs into the summit, to promote the international agenda for improved access and ability to use and leverage environmental data and information for the benefit of all communities of our global society. Participants to the Civil Society Forum will also participate in the Eye on Earth Summit.

The Forum is expected to solicit inputs of civil society in addressing the overall expected result of the Summit, and to help create a consensus on key areas of access to environmental and societal information, as well as to collaborate towards strengthening existing initiatives and filling gaps towards more informed policy making and a sustainable future.

Mechanisms, 4. Recommendations.
