- UN system report on Post-2015 Development Agenda (June 2012)
- High Level Panel of Eminent Persons on the Post-2015
 Development Agenda: to present final report in May 2013
- 2013 UN General Assembly: high level summit to review progress of the MDGs



Post-2015 process

High level Panel on Post-2015 Development Agenda

Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)

Mandated by 2010 MDG summit

- Established in July 2012
- 5 meetings (Sept. 2012 Mar. 2013)
- Draft report to be submitted to SG by March 2013
- SG to submit report to GA at its 68th session (Sept. 2013)

Process mandated by Rio+20 outcome document

- Intergovernmental Open
 Working Group (OWG)
 established by GA in Sept. 2012
- MGS input into the OWG facilitated by UN DESA
- Report to be submitted to GA during its 68th session (Sept. 2013)



Post-2015 Development Agenda

Strategy based on 3 pillars of work:

Inclusive national, regional & global consultation processes

building on on-going consultations & feeding into the post-2015 formal process.

Thematic consultations

with academia, media, private sector, employers and trade unions, civil society, and decision makers on the current central challenges to development.

Global Conversation:

Web Portal, big data analytics and citizen mobilization to allow open interaction and information exchange among a range of stakeholders.



National consultations

- Timeline: May 2012 first quarter 2013
- Ensure participation of all stakeholders: facilitate the inclusion of voices of poor people and those that are vulnerable,
- 58 countries: representative sample across several dimensions (regional, country typology, and different types of development challenges)
- African countries: Angola, Burkina Faso, Central African Republic, Congo DRC, Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Mali, Malawi, Mauritius, Mozambique, Niger, Nigeria, Senegal, South Africa, Tanzania, Togo, Uganda, Zambia



Thematic consultations

- UN Development Group: 11 global thematic consultations
- Objective:
 - 'catalyze inclusive conversations and bottom-up feedback on the post-2015 Development Agenda'
 - Facilitate an open dialogue
 - Review progress on MDGs
 - Discuss options for a new framework
- Cross-cutting elements:
 - Gender equality
 - Young people
 - Human rights



Phase 1

(Oct. 2012- Jan. 2013)



- Open call for discussion papers
- Identification of key stakeholders
- Outreach
- Leadership Meeting (governments, UN agencies, academia, civil society)

Phase 2

(Jan. – Mar. 2013)

- Global Online
 Discussion Platform:
 framed consultations
 around different topics
- Inclusive, concrete and transparent process
- Final report: April 2013□HLP & GA



Environmental Sustainability Thematic Consultation: Timeline and key milestones

Oct. 2012

- Agreement on concept note by Steering Group
- Agreement on online platform and outreach networks

Nov. 2012

- Call for inputs and discussion papers
- Discussion papers, videos, etc. submitted as inputs online

Dec. 2012

Key persons identified and invited to Leadership Meeting

Jan. 2013

- Leadership meeting defines key areas and facilitators
- Online discussions launched by facilitators

Feb. 2013

Facilitators post key ideas and outline draft final report for comment

Mar. 2013

Final report posted online for comment and endorsed after incorporation of comments
