

**INPUTS FROM MEXICO TO THE CONCEPT NOTE TO BE
DEVELOPED ON THE THEME OF UNEA-3**

In the development of the concept note on the central theme of UNEA-3, Mexico submits the following inputs to be considered by the Secretariat. Some of the elements have already been expressed by the Permanent Mission in a verbal manner during meetings of the Subcommittee of the CPR.

- The **provisional title** “*Pollution free planet: delivering a deal to clean the world*” must still be agreed upon by Member States to reflect a positive and pro-active approach.
- Importance of **recovering core aspects** of themes 2 (*Planet 2.0: how to prepare the planet for 3 degrees and 9 billion people*) and 3 (*#NatureForAll: how to create harmony for people and the planet*), that are of importance to delegations that expressed their preference for those themes.
- **Avoid replicating discussions** from UNEA-2 regarding human health.
- Design a **Global Scenario Action Plan** as one of the outcomes of UNEA-3. The action plan should be comprehensive to address different environmental challenges for the coming decades and allow for near-term pro-active policies.
- Ensure that UNEA and UNEP provide continuous and timely **inputs to the High Level Political Forum** on Sustainable Development, particularly for chemical and wastes sound management.
- **Climate change**: take stock of the achievements of the UNFCCC COP21 and COP22, and especially UNEA’s role in supporting the implementation of the Paris Agreement, including the positive effects of the Kigali Amendment to the Montreal Protocol to phase down the consumption and production of Hydrofluorocarbons (HFC), as well as the effects of the activities done in the Climate and Clean Air Coalition (CCAC).
- **Biodiversity**: implementation of the results of the CBD COP-13 regarding the mainstreaming of the conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity. Take into account an ecosystems-based and ecosystem services approach related to air, land, and sea-based pollutants.
- Strengthening the **international cooperation** in its different modalities, encouraging coherence between environmental-related decisions taken in other UN fora, as well as fostering **public-private** partnerships and the involvement of relevant **stakeholders**.
