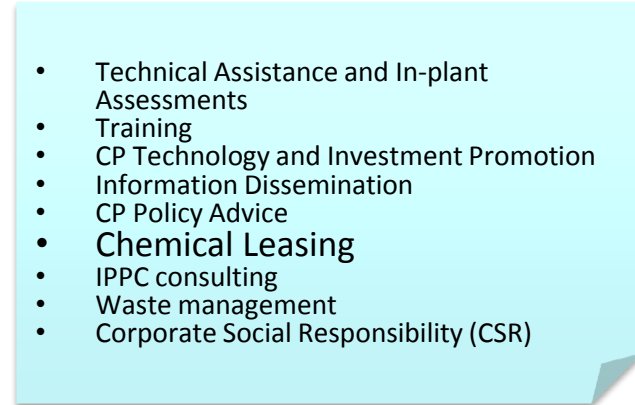
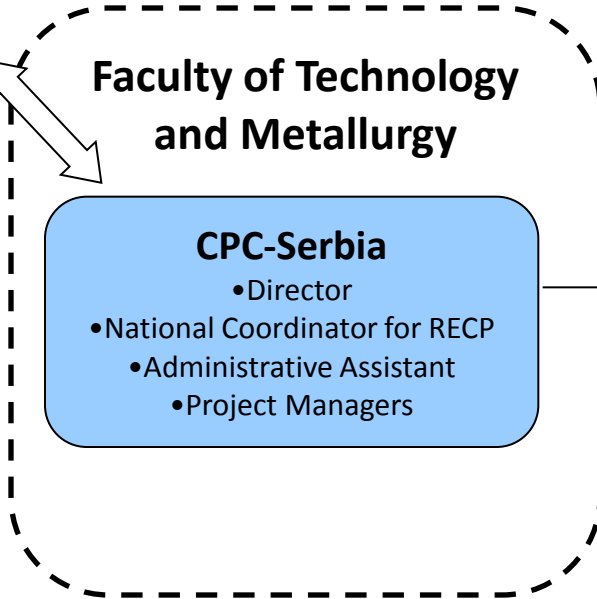


THE SERBIAN CPC

- So far, (2006-2017) total of 92 companies participated in full assessments with about 40,000 employees
- Average savings per company: 100,000 EUR/year
- Average decrease of water consumption: 50,000 m3/year

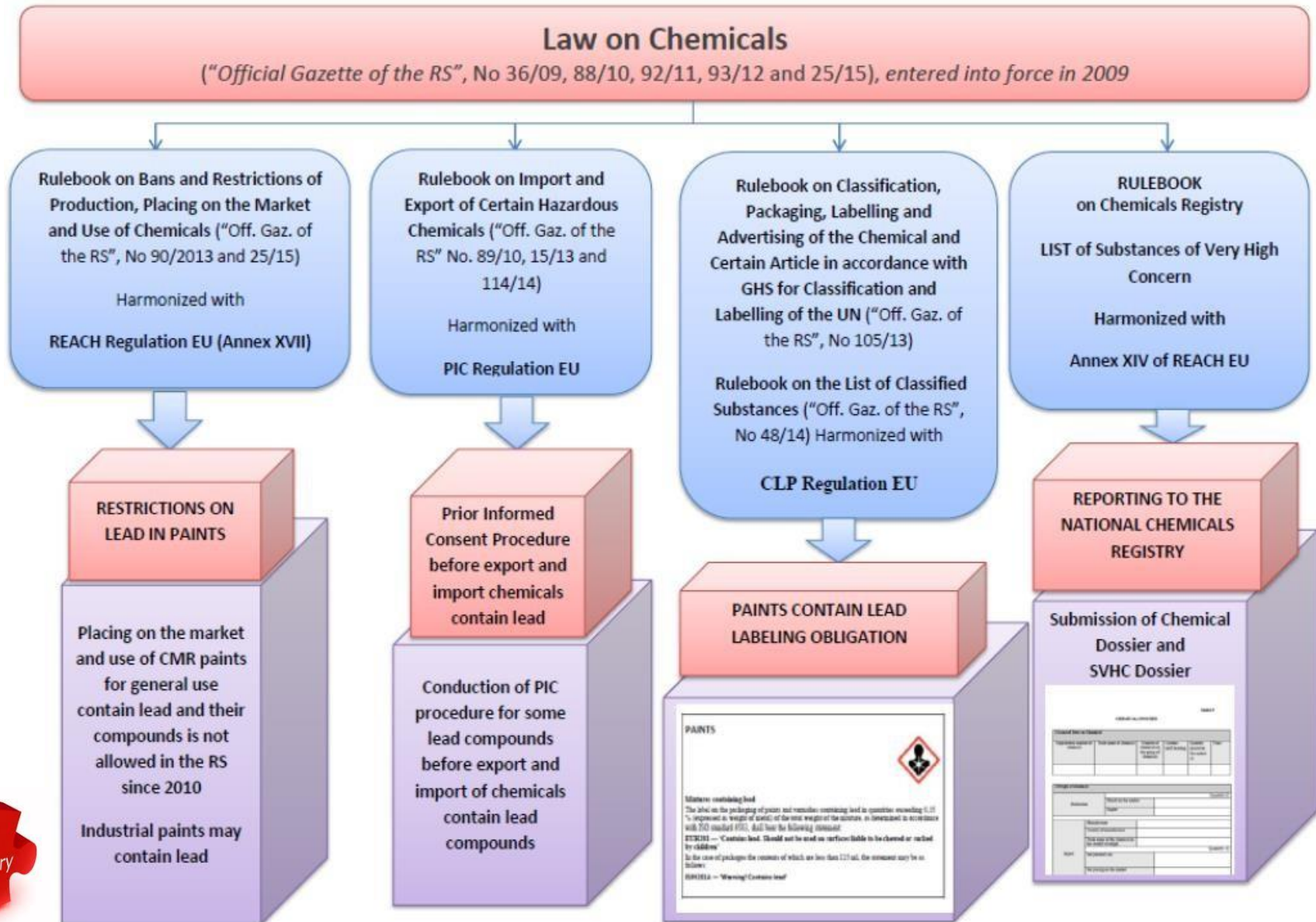

Legislative Framework



Legislation Summary

- Republic of Serbia has established legislative and institutional framework for Chemical sound management harmonized with EU legislation;
- Reduction of placing on the market and use of paints contain lead for industrial use after 2012;
- Central staff, enforcement authorities and industry have adequate knowledge on chemicals sound management;
- Republic of Serbia has help-desk for chemicals and BP for support industry, NGOs and other stakeholders

Expertise of NCPC Serbia in Relevant Field

- RECP assessment in 2 biggest paint producers in the country (holding 20 % of market share)
- RECP assessment in more than 10 companies with paint application (mostly SME's)
- Consultation on draft model law on lead in paints for EPA

- Strong links with ex-chemicals agency (now department for chemicals)
- Competent staff for paint formulation, production and application
- Coordinators for regional projects working with 10+ countries

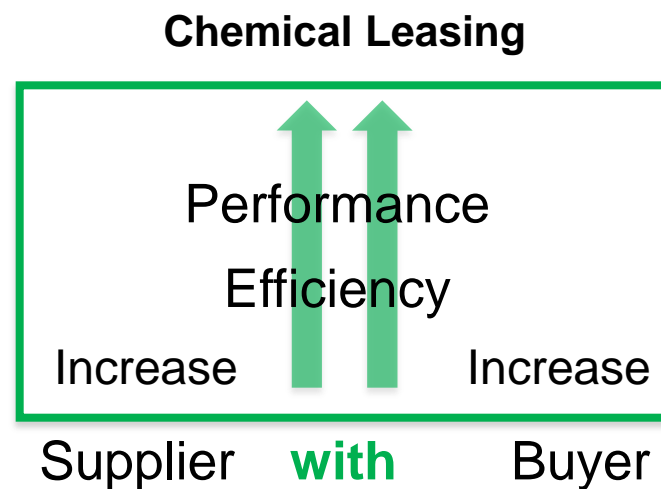
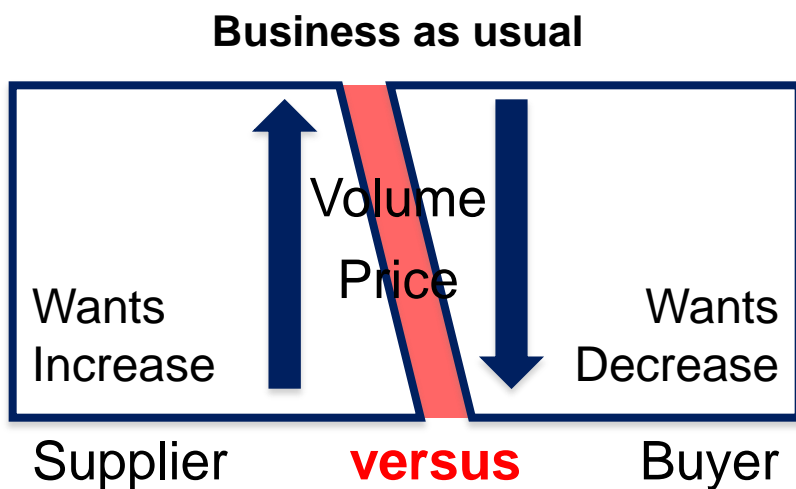
