Functions of the UN Environment Assembly



Governing Council decision 27/2, paragraph 5 (Feb 2013)

- (a) Sets the global environmental agenda;
- (b) Provides overarching **policy guidance** and defines policy responses to address emerging environmental challenges;
- (c) Undertakes policy review, dialogue and exchange of experiences;
- (d) Provides strategic guidance to the **UN Environment Programme**;
- (e) Organizes a multi-stakeholder dialogue;
- (f) Fosters partnerships for achieving environmental goals and resource mobilization

The highest decision-making body on environment



Membership

Assembly consists of 193 UN member States

Bureau consists of 10 members

Accredited Major Groups and other Stakeholders to the UN Environment Programme

Meeting

UNEA meets biennially in even years.

Preceded by a meeting of the Open-Ended Committee of Permanent Representatives which serves as a preparatory conference for UNFA.

5 days, including a two-day high-level segment at the end of session

Outcome

Resolutions, decisions and other outcome documents as decided by member States.


"Innovative solutions for environmental challenges and sustainable consumption and production"

- Under the overall theme the 2019 UN Environment Assembly will address the following three focus areas:
 - (a) environmental challenges related to poverty and natural resources management, including sustainable food systems, food security and halting biodiversity loss;
 - (b) life-cycle approaches to resource efficiency, energy, chemicals and waste management; and
 - (c) innovative sustainable business development at a time of rapid technological change.

Elements of UNEA

- (a) **Plenary:** Reporting from the OECPR and possible actions on resolutions; Summary of commitments from Governments/Private Sectors/Stakeholders & dialogues. Only accredited organizations can attend.
- (b) **Committee of the Whole:** Negotiate pending resolutions including through drafting groups. Accredited Major Groups and Stakeholders will be allocated seats to observe the proceedings.
- (c) **National Statements:** The national statements under the theme of the Assembly, will take place on from Tuesday 12 to Friday 15 March 2019. Statements are open to representatives of member States, Specialized Agencies, United Nations bodies, other intergovernmental organizations and accredited Major Groups and Stakeholders. Only accredited organizations can attend.
- (d) **Side Events:** Fourteen official side events held throughout the week from 13:00 15:00 and 18:00 19:45. Open for all to attend
- (e) **Media events:** Various press events throughout the week. Open for all to attend





- (f) **High Level Segment:** Held from Thursday 14 Friday 15 March. Only accredited organizations can attend. Includes national statements and the following:
- (g) **Leadership Dialogues:** 3 sessions that address key issues relating to the theme of the Assembly and to the implementation of the UN Sustainable Development Goals, to create a political momentum and direction towards addressing key policy and action gaps at the global, regional, national and local levels. Held from Thursday 14 Friday 15 March.
- (h) **Multi-stakeholder dialogue:** Held on Thursday 14 March. Provide ministers and leaders from civil society, business community, and international organizations with the opportunity to engage in an interactive exchange of views on priorities, best practices, challenges and actions relating to the overall theme of the Assembly
