The side event will offer a platform for reflection on sustainable tourism. The sector has significantly contributed to the Mediterranean region's <u>economic development</u>, but unsustainable practices have taken a toll on marine and coastal ecosystems.

The side event will showcase global and regional initiatives: the One Planet Network – Sustainable Tourism Programme, the Glasgow Declaration on Climate Action in Tourism, the Global Tourism Plastics Initiative (GTPI), the Blue Tourism Initiative for Marine Regions, the EU InterregMed Sustainable Tourism Community and the Mediterranean Ecotourism Consortium. It will also promote good practices at national and local levels in Greece and in Balearic Islands, Spain.

The side event will disseminate recent publications, including practical tools for tourism businesses. Plan Bleu, a UNEP/MAP Regional Activity Centre, will present the findings of recent publications: State of Play of Tourism in the Mediterranean; Catalogue of Best practices on Sustainable Tourism in the Mediterranean; and Guidelines for sustainability of the cruise and recreational boating sector.
