

# SP 2 EA A January 2018 – June 2019 progress



#### **Risk Reduction:**

- UNEP supported 17 countries in reducing the risks of disasters, industrial accidents and conflicts.
- Conflict and disaster risk assessments, guidance on policy and best practices, training and capacity building and preparedness on environmental emergencies.
- Supporting conflict debris management, oil pollution clean-up, safe production methods.


