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Background

- 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development
 - Stresses the important role of regional organizations in SDG implementation, follow-up and review
 - Suggests that follow-up and review of regional level can provide useful opportunities for peer learning, sharing of best practices and discussion on shared targets
 - Promotes inclusive regional process to draw on national-level reviews and contribute to follow-up and review on global level
- UNEA Resolution 2/10 : invites Regional Seas Programme to work towards SDG implementation and reporting
- 18th Global Meeting of Regional Seas : regions to prepare SDG outlook documents
- Guidance prepared by UNEP

SDG Outlook Objective

- Guide COBSEA in supporting tracking and implementation of relevant ocean-related Sustainable Development Goals

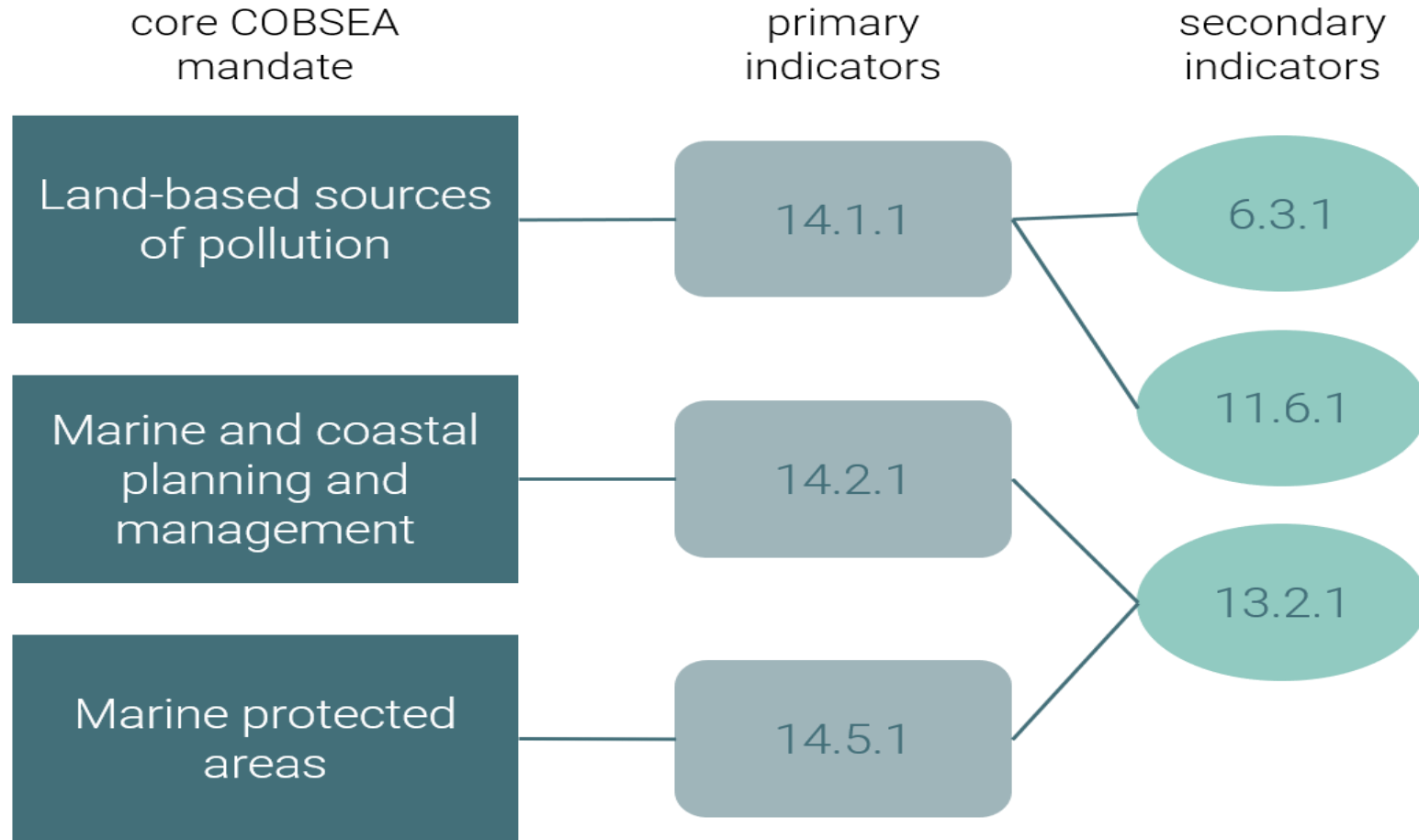
SDG Outlook timeline

- 2nd Extraordinary IGM : Outlook discussed and funds allocated towards process
- 24th COBSEA IGM : Secretariat presented progress, including initial draft outlook document, agreed process for further development and finalization
- Outlook workshop : development and finalization of Outlook
- 25th COBSEA IGM : final draft for consideration

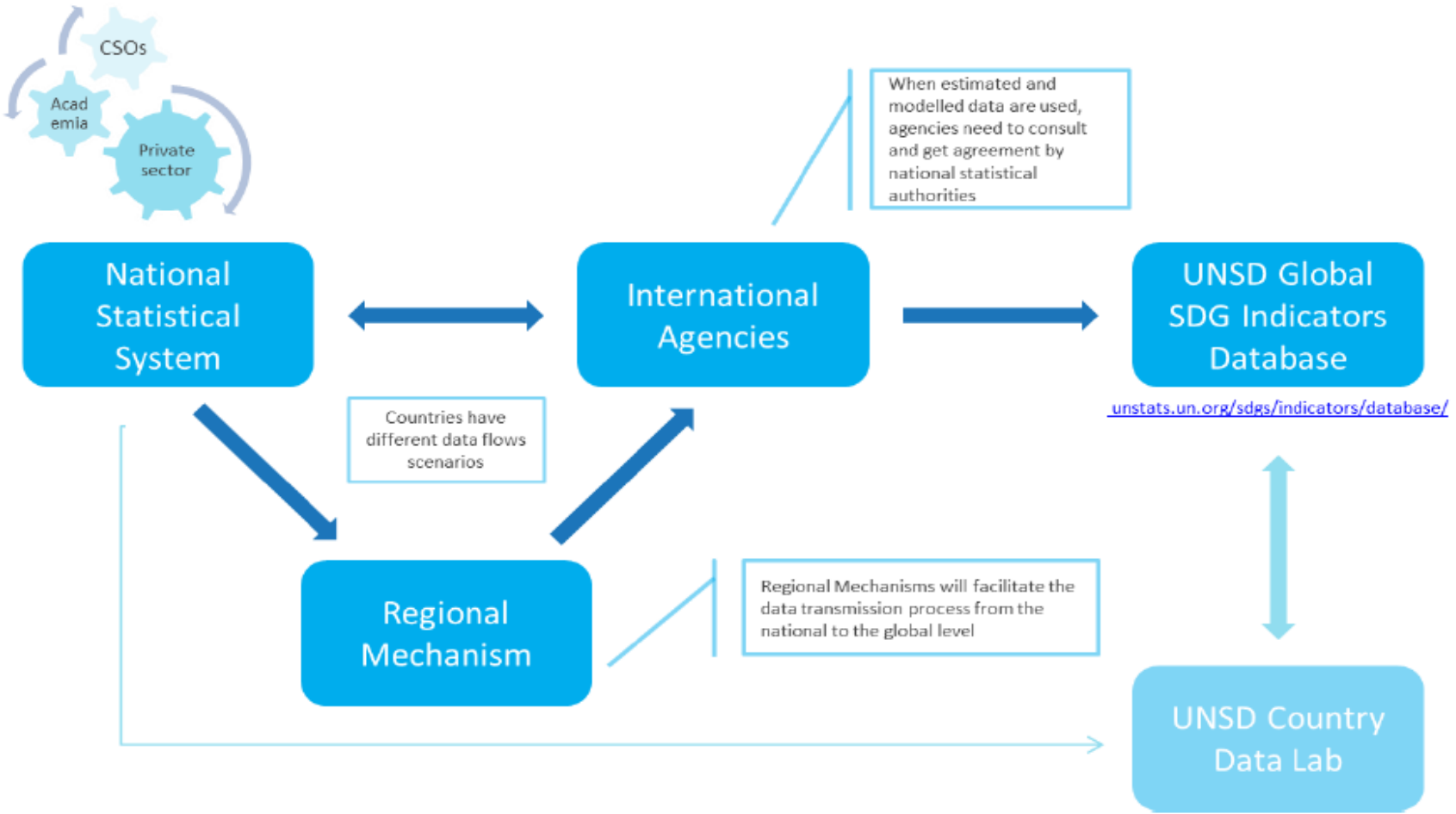
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Ocean-related SDG targets relevant for COBSEA

Regional Seas Indicators

Regional Seas Indicator Working Group:

- 22 regional ecosystem-based indicators agreed
- Incorporating/directly addressing SDG target indicators
- Linking policy and operational objectives and action
- Enables comparability between regions, and sharing of best practices and lessons learned

Relevance for COBSEA: high applicability, relative ease of adaptation and adoption, benefit of exchange with and assistance from UNEP and other Regional Seas

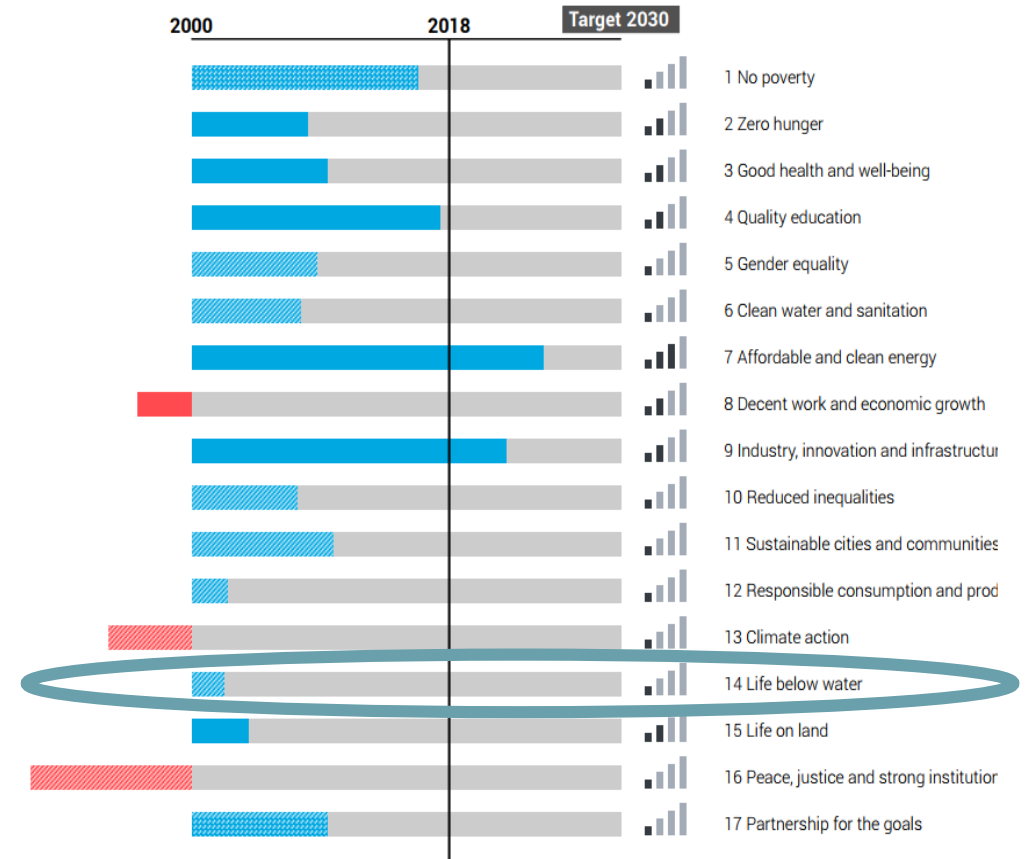

Regional and country analysis

- Low SDG 14 data availability, hindered by data collection challenges
- Some development to increase coverage of MPAs in region documented, progress still needed
- Fragmented reporting on ocean-related SDGs in VNRs from region
- National plans and frameworks addressing ocean-related SDGs exist in COBSEA countries

Indicator-based assessment

Tracking and reporting on SDG progress: Some ongoing assessment, use of indicators and existing capacity uneven/unknown, overall limited data coverage

Strengthened indicator-based assessment, focusing on SDG targets where COBSEA has a specific mandate and comparative advantage, enables improved National reporting and decision support as well as better tracking delivery of 2030 Agenda

Indicator-based assessment – key actions

- Establish COBSEA working group / pool of experts on SDGs, with a focus on indicators, assessment and reporting
- Map indicators and methods used in countries as well as current institutional and human capacity, as basis for identification of common core set of indicators
- Strengthen country efforts/capacity to monitor and report, focusing on the common core indicators (training, guidance, sharing of experiences and best practice) and identified needs
- Where relevant, promote harmonization across countries

NB work on marine litter monitoring underway on basis of RAP MALI, working group on marine litter and ongoing projects

Cooperation and capacity building – key actions

Conduct capacity building e.g. in relation to monitoring and reporting, documenting and sharing SDG implementation best practices and lessons learned

Strengthen cooperation and information sharing with relevant regional entities

- e.g. with IOC-WESTPAC and PEMSEA, to support capacity building and to document and share SDG implementation best practices and lessons learned
- with ESCAP to promote SDG 14 assessment in VNR reporting through APFSD subregional preparatory meetings and inter-agency Regional Collaborative Platform

Develop new interlinked regional and national Voluntary Commitments (VCs) towards UN Ocean Conference 2020

Delivering key actions

Leverage current COBSEA projects (e.g. on ML) and prioritize project development to deliver on key actions identified in Outlook document

Leverage capacity within region/among countries including exploring establishment of Regional Activity Centre for monitoring and assessment
