Technical Meeting of the Latin American and Caribbean Initiative for Sustainable Development (ILAC) Caribbean Working Group on Environmental Indicators. Oct 2017, Port of Spain, T&T

The Environmental Management Authority (EMA) and UN Environment co-organized the event that hosted 83 participants from 11 countries of anglophone and francophone Caribbean, representing governments, civil society and the private sector.

Objectives:

- Learn more about Status and Trends of the Environment in Latin America and the Caribbean (GEO-6);
- Decide on a core set of multi-purpose environmental indicators that could be implemented in a short amount of time, to help track the state of the environment in the Caribbean

Meeting of the Latin America and the Caribbean Initiative for Sustainable Development (ILAC) Working Group on Environmental Indicators (WGEI) October 2018, Port of Spain, T&T

Decision made on 13 indicators and metadata mostly agreed upon:

- Biodiversity forest cover, terrestrial protected areas, marine protected areas
- Energy renewable energy, energy intensity
- Governance land use plans, reports on the state of environment
- Risk occurrence of natural disasters, percentage of affected people, DRR strategies
- Waste total waste to landfill, national recycling rate,
- Water proportion of bodies of water with good ambient water quality

The National Environment and Planning Agency of Jamaica and UN Environment co-organising the event. 50 participants expected.

Objectives:

- Review progress (from last October) towards the ILAC core set of multi-purpose environmental indicators for the Caribbean;
- strengthen regional capacity in data-gathering, processing and communication of environmental indicators and;
- Agree on effective ways to communicate environmental information to support decision makers and public policy.

The three-day meeting will host thematic sessions on cross-cutting topics such as:

- Environmental Information Systems;
- State of the Environment Reports;
- Waste management;
- Ocean monitoring;
- Disaster risk reduction.
