## **Objectives**

- Prepared by: Katharina Rogalla von Bieberstein (UNEP-WCMC) in May 2020, building on input from convention secretariats and with the financial support of Switzerland.
- Purpose: support achievement of the workshop objectives, with respect to identifying:
  - > concrete elements to be included in the post-2020 global biodiversity framework
  - > concrete mechanisms for monitoring and reviewing its implementation
  - ➤ how conventions other than CBD can contribute to its development and operationalization thereby strengthening cooperation among and coherent implementation of conventions with respect to biodiversity and ecosystem services
- Approach: Provide background and 'food for thought' which:
  - informs workshop participants, without being exhaustive or promoting a particular outcome
  - > presents topics/questions to facilitate and encourage discussion before and at the workshop

#### Context

- **UNGA Resolution 65/161:** recognized the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011-2020 as a universal framework for action on biodiversity and a foundation for sustainable development for all stakeholders, including agencies across the UN system.
- Other conventions: thanks to the Biodiversity Liaison Group, five biodiversity-related conventions
  other than the Convention on Biological Diversity also recognized it
- So in 2021: the post-2020 global biodiversity framework should go further and:
  - > be universal in terms of relevance and ownership THE framework of action for biodiversity
  - draw attention at level high political levels, and mobilize action of all stakeholders,
  - > relate to and support other frameworks/processes with direct impact on biodiversity

Active engagement of biodiversity-related conventions, Rio conventions,

Key step → other relevant MEAs and UN organisations in development and implementation of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework

#### **Overview**

Each section provides suggestions of questions that could be addressed during the workshop, and also a list of key sources that could provide further information. Neither is intended to be exhaustive, but should help provide support to participants.

Three sections, following the structure of the workshop agenda:

**A - Thematic issues** 

**B** - Implementation issues

**C - Operationalisation by other conventions and processes** 

#### A - Thematic issues

Suggestions of topics that would be relevant for discussion relating to the drafting of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework and its future implementation:

- a) Identification of draft goals, targets and indicators that are of highest priority to MEAs, and whether these are currently addressed in the most useful way
- b) Identification of gaps in the draft, and whether the topics not covered should be integrated in the currently proposed goals, targets and indicators or by new proposals
- c) Needs and opportunities for developing joint work programmes, potentially with one lead MEA
- d) Opportunities for greater harmonisation of the use of indicators across MEAs
- e) Ensuring cooperation and synergies for the implementation of the long-term approach to mainstreaming being developed by the Convention on Biological Diversity

### **B** - Implementation issues

Suggestions of relevant topics for discussion during Bern II workshop:

- a) Role of other MEAs in implementation of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework, and elements to include in the framework and in other CBD COP-15 decisions to facilitate this role
- b) Potential relevance of a specific MEAs leading implementation of specific activities, including the relationship to other sectors (for example chemicals and waste)
- c) Potential need for cross-referencing MEAs monitoring and reporting frameworks, and opportunities for identifying synergies in review and reporting mechanisms
- d) Facilitating coherent implementation of MEAs at national level (strengthening cooperation mechanisms amongst focal points, role of regional/sub-regional workshops on NBSAPs, etc)
- e) Cooperation in capacity-building, technical and scientific cooperation, resource mobilization, etc

# C - Operationalisation by other conventions and processes

Suggestions of relevant topics for discussion during Bern II workshop:

- a) Reflection of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework in decisions of other MEAs
- b) Alignment of different MEA strategies/targets/indicators with the post-2020 gobal biodiversity framework
- c) Addressing differences in process timings, for example potential coordination and streamlining of meetings, synergies in implementation reviews, joint secretariat activities, etc.
- Role of cooperation mechanisms among conventions, opportunities for strengthening these mechansims in different ways
- e) Showcasing the post-2020 global biodiversity framework as a vehicle for delivering the SDGs...




