What kind of additional support you will receive if you became the next Co-Facilitator: I do not expect any additional financial support from my organization for taking on this role. I do imagine that I will receive advice and other non-financial support from numerous colleagues in other organizations.

What is your background in NGOs and Civil Society work on the ground?: In 2006, I founded The Center for Oceanic Awareness, Research, and Education (COARE), and continue to serve as its Executive Director. A number of our programs have an international scope, particularly those in Marine Spacial Planning, Shark Conservation and Sustainable Fisheries, and Plastic Pollution. In addition to my duties as Executive Director, I serve as Chief Policy Analyst and represent the organisation in official fora. To date, COARE has engaged stakeholders and supported members through multiple fora, including The UN Ocean Conference (2017), the Global Programme of Action for the Protection of the Marine Environment from Land- based Activities (GPA), the 2018 Intergovernmental Review of the GPA (IGR), The Our Ocean Conference, the Global Partnership on Marine Litter (GPML), all meetings of the Ad-hoc Open Ended Expert Group on Marine Litter and Microplastic (AHEG), and the UN Environment Assembly. COARE is accredited to the UN Environment Programme, is associated with the UN Department of Global Communication, and has consultative status through ECOSOC.

Why do you want to be a Co-Facilitator of the UNEP NGO MG?: Growing up in New York, it is very common for schools to tour the UN Headquarters. I had forgotten what that was like until decades later when I was sitting in Conference Room 4 about to take the floor for the first time. I suddenly flashed back to my childhood, where I held the headphone to my ear and switch between the different languages as the speaker was simultaneously translated. I suddenly realized I was now about to be the voice on the other end. From my very first international meeting, and with each and every engagement, I become more enthusiastic about international collaboration and inclusive processes. Anyone who has worked with me can attest to my jovial and optimistic nature, and I am eager to continue to get more involved in the NGO Major Group, and to serve as a leader and guide to help foster and encourage participation and equity. I am patient, compassionate, and understanding, and I believe my experience with the UN System and in international fora would serve me well in this role.

If so, when and what were the accomplishments for the NGO MG then?: N/A

What is your vision for how CSOs can better inform environmental governance at the global level including UNEP?:

Civil Society involvement is an extraordinarily important component of global environmental governance. CSOs often provide the research, data, expertise, and interpretation that are required to inform and influence governmental decisions. However, it is important that CSOs and State delegations understand each other to work in a cohesive manner. At the last UNEA, for example, at the request of certain Members, all CSOs were excluded from a number of meetings which they would normally attend. This exclusion was sparked by a few CSO delegates speaking out of turn and not respecting protocol. I believe that a more collaborative situation would have persisted if the involved CSO members were properly informed of their roles and expected protocol. I also feel that Major Group statements, and especially joint MG statements, can be extremely powerful, but are under-utilized in many meetings.

What is your goals for the UNEP NGO MG over the course of the next two years, and how would you make these goals a reality?:

As I mentioned, I believe that CSOs can and should be involved to inform global environmental governance, and the NGO Major Group is one of the most important, if not only the largest, of the nine. With the vast and diverse number of accredited organizations within the NGO MG, it is especially important that they all have the resources they need to participate respectfully, yet confidently and effectively, in meetings and fora. I also suggested that more NGO MG statements and joint MG statements would be welcome and helpful to inform governance decisions. During the next two years, I propose to address these needs by continuing to build upon work by Griffins and Khawla to develop a robust communication infrastructure necessary to communicate with and to NGO leaders as well as delegates to various meetings. I hope to ensure that newly accredited organizations, as well as newly appointed delegates from previously existing NGOs have access to and have reviewed relevant helpful information to ensure their success. Different communication needs and expectations are required for different purposes, and effective communication is essential to develop MG and joint statements in a timely and useful manner. To that end, I also expect to work closely with and develop effective working relationships with MGFC members from other Major Groups.
