







About the course



The e-learning course "Introduction to SCP in Africa" is geared towards policymakers in Africa who want to advance sustainable consumption and production in their countries.

The course is delivered in English and French language. During its edition 108 key stakeholders from 33 African countries were trained, including all partner countries of the SWITCH Africa Green project. Evidence of impact from the course include:

- In Mauritius, an action plan to promote eco-friendly bags is currently being implemented
- In DRC, a National Sustainable Public Procurement Plan is under discussion between the Ministry of Environment and the Ministry of Finance.

To develop and deliver the course, the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR) collaborated with the UN Environment Regional office of Africa within the framework of the EU-funded SWITCH Africa Green project, as well as the Secretariat of the 10-Years Framework of Programmes (10YFP).



- * 96% of respondents evaluated the course as very or mostly useful after 6 months
- 91 % often or very often use the knowledge acquired (e.g. in their profession)
- The course has triggered diverse actions and impacts in the region
