
### **FAITH FOR EARTH**

#### Faith + Food Coalition: Regenerating the Earth

## The Road to Glasgow: An Informative Workshop to Coordinate FBO Actions Leading to COP26

The workshop seeks to accelerate climate action among different stakeholders in an informative, inclusive, and action-oriented way.


The workshop will inform about the findings of the Survey on Faith-Based Climate Action conducted by the Interfaith Task Force on Climate Change, and the Faith and Science Dialogue Series presented by the Vatican and the British and Italian Embassies to the Holy See. The Workshop will also highlight some examples of faith-based activities in the lead-up to and during COP26, and will provide an open forum to discuss the status quo, consolidate collaborative efforts, and plan next steps together.

#### Healing the World: Prayers and Reflections for All Sentient Beings

Building upon and celebrating the <u>UN Vesak Day dialogue</u> in 2020, the <u>Buddhist Tzu Chi</u> <u>Foundation</u> will convene representatives from a diverse range of organizations representing Buddhist, Interfaith, Faith and UN voices to present digital offerings in the forms of prayers reflections. On 26 May 2021 at 8am EST, Dr. Iyad Abumoghli will reflect on a vision for the road to recovery, and through interfaith partnership, how FBOs are able to simultaneously address the impacts of the pandemic and build climate resilience in the most vulnerable communities around the world.

Join Faith for Earth on 4 June 2021 in a webinar hosted by World Vision discussing the key drivers and consequences of deforestation and landscape degradation as well as nature-based solutions (NBS) and activities by World Vision across the globe. The event will hear directly from a child beneficiary on how the unique potential of children and youth can be unleashed to support ecosystem restoration. In addition, the event will focus on the important value-add that faith-leaders and communities can play in championing ecosystem restoration and promising solutions and how governments are prioritising NBS, including FMNR, and what more can be done by governments and donors to support ecosystem restoration.

#### **UNEP India: Launch of The Faith for Earth Councillor Action Plans**

UNEP India has planned various events from April leading to World Environment Day and in support of the launch of the UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration.

The Faith for Earth Councillor Online Recognition and Pledge Ceremony will take place on 3 June 12:30pm IST // 10am EAT to launch a series of FBOs' Action Plans contributing to Ecosystem Restoration; Climate Action; Efficient Resource Management; and Biodiversity. Around 70 FBOs participated in the program representing the diversity of religions in India.

UNEP Faith for Earth Initiative in collaboration with UNEP India and the United Religions Initiative (URI) designed a series of workshops for 'Faith leaders' – religious and social leaders. Using the train-the-trainers model, Faith for Earth Councillors will be the point of contact for their FBOs and will be encouraged to grow grassroot environmental action in their communities to fight the climate crisis.

UNEP India launched <u>Faith for Earth in India</u> in June 2020, being the first country-programme to adapt a structured approach for collaboration with Faith-based organisations. Read more about the <u>Faith for Earth National Coordination Hubs.</u>

#### **Living Chapel Design Principles**

Inspired by the <u>Laudato Si': Care for Our Common Home</u>, the <u>Living Chapel</u> represents a model of sustainable and "living" architecture conceived to inspire new spaces of spirituality and ecological awareness among all people of all religions. The Living Chapel is a site-specific artistic installation which meets the challenges of climate change through 4 fundamental and distinctive design principles: 1) Use of renewable energy sources; 2) Materials recycling and re-use; 3) Sustainable water management; and 4) Knowledge and experience in green management.
