On The Road To Glasgow

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

Less than 100 days are remaining to COP26 in Glasgow, but it is actually less than 8.5 years remaining if we are to stay below the 1.5 C target. Are we on the right track? Are we presenting ambitious commitments? How is the faith community getting on and driving action on the road to COP 26?

Over the past few weeks, important efforts have been exerted to bring the faith voices to be heard loud and clear. The Holy See, the UK and Italian Governments are leading the Faith and Science Dialogue series in preparation for a global conference to be held in October prior to COP26 with a high possibility of the participation of Pope Francis in COP26 with an interfaith appeal. In the technical meeting held on 24 July, faith leaders discussed practical commitments related to reducing the climate impacts of faith assets and investment.

The Multi-Faith Advisory Council of the UN Task Force on Religion and Development has also been active in bringing the faith community to show leadership and commitment with the participation of UNEP and UNFCCC. We need more and we need it now!

The beautifully designed Guide demonstrates a clear nexus between Faith teachings and practices through practical suggestions and storytelling, provides a primer of the climate crises, and encourages the *Ummah* and civil society to employ more thoughtful techniques as they embark on Hajj and Umrah.

FBOS USING THE CLIMATE INITIATIVES PLATFORM TOWARDS COP26





INTERNATIONAL ONLINE CONSULTATION FOR ACCREDITED FBOS

Tuesday, 7 September - Thursday, 9 September 2021

An international online consultation for Major Groups and Stakeholders will take place on 7-9 September 2021, where several sessions will be held around noon/ early afternoon (please save the date for the three days from 11am-3pm GMT 3+ <u>tentatively</u>).

The consultation will be held as part of the preparations for UNEA 5.2 in February 2022 as well as UNEP@50 and Stockholm+50. The consultation will come just before the meeting of the Committee of the Permanent Representative (CPR) Bureau and the 155th meeting of the CPR.

The Registration Link will be shared at a later date, as well as the Programme which is being developed by a Consultation Planning Team with representatives from different MGs and thematic clusters.

POST 2020 BIODIVERSITY FRAMEWORK



The Secretariat of the UN Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) has published the first draft of the Post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework.

A working group of the Multi-Faith Advisory Council for biodiversity has been constituted to discuss a coordinated approach by the faith-based network in addressing the preservation and loss of biodiversity.

Mangroves are important players in some of the greatest challenges facing the world today. They provide a barrier between land & sea, absorb carbon, contribute to economic & food security, & are home to some of the most rare and colourful species.

Did you know that mangroves extract up to five times more carbon from the atmosphere than forests on land, and protecting mangroves is 1000 times less expensive, per kilometre, than building seawalls? Yet, mangroves are disappearing at accelerating rates.
