## **Project Description**

The Trash Free Waters Initiative is a partnership between the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Peace Corps, the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) Cartagena Convention Secretariat, UNEP Regional Office for Latin America and its Caribbean Sub-Regional Office.

The main objective of the partnership is to reduce and ultimately prevent land-based trash from entering watersheds, coastal waters, and the marine environment.

## Main Achievements/Results

### **Jamaica**



Over 200 labelled bins were placed in over 30 locations in the communities.



Outreach efforts impacted approximately 2,400 students and over 1,045 adults.



Five local schools were provided with reusable utensils for their students.



A metal garbage skip was constructed to increase the capacity of the waste disposal system.

#### **Panama**



More than 400 students, from four educational institutions were trained in solid waste management.



The shoppers and business owners of Libros Los Pueblos Shopping Center in Juan Diaz were educated on the value of better solid waste management practices.



Ten volunteers were trained in community sensitization on proper waste disposal.
