Our delegation would like to convey our appreciation to the Co-facilitators of 73/333 from Pakistan and Estonia, who have brought us to nearing the conclusion of the Political Declaration 73/333 as an outcome document of UNEP@50. We would like to see this document pronounces itself to strengthening the United Nations Environment Programme as a leading global environmental body that sets the global environmental agenda, as well as to strengthening United Nations Office in Nairobi as the only United Nations office in the global South.

Madam Chair, Excellencies,

We have 16 (sixteen) draft resolutions under 5 (five) clusters. We applaud the co-facilitators who have shepherd the discussion thus far, nearing to the consensus result.

Our delegation seeks the kind support from all delegation for our draft resolution on Sustainable Lake Management, co-sponsored by Pakistan. We believe that this draft resolution can serve as an avenue to ensure a better future of our lake ecosystem, our people, and for the next generation.

Indonesia also wishes that the other draft resolutions can have a fruitful discussion and arrive to the desired conclusion.

To conclude, Indonesia would like to reiterate its readiness to engage constructively in the OECPR, with the view to arrive to a fruitful outcome for the preparation of UNEA 5.2 and UNEP@50.
