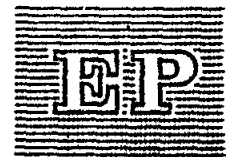

Meeting of the Bureau of the
Contracting Parties to the Convention
for the Protection of the Mediterranean
Sea against Pollution

Athens, 14-15 June 1985

REPORT

1. The Bureau met on 14-15 June 1985 in Athens in the premises of the Co-ordinating Unit of the Mediterranean Action Plan. The Meeting was chaired by H.E. Mr Zivorad Kovacevic (Yugoslavia) and H.E. Mr Abdel Razek (Egypt) and Mr J. Ros (Spain), vice-presidents and Ms H. Baccar (Tunisia), Rapporteur, were also present. The secretariat was represented by Mr S. Keckes, Director of OCA/PAC, Mr A. Manos, Co-ordinator of the Mediterranean Action Plan and Mr L. Jeftic, Senior Marine Scientist. The Meeting was opened on 14 June 1985 at 10 o'clock and ended on 15 June 1985.

Progress Report

2. Mr A. Manos provided the Bureau with a written and oral presentation of the activities from the previous meeting to date contained in the document "Progress Report by the Co-ordinator" (Annex I). The Bureau took note of the report and made the following comments:

3. Concerning the Regional Activity Centre for the Specially Protected Areas, concern was expressed about the slow progress of actions taking place since the signature of the agreement between the Centre and IUCN (March 1985) and requested the Secretariat to speed up the procedure.

4. The Bureau noted the report of the recent meeting of the Blue Plan/Priority Actions Programme focal points (UNEP/WG.129/8). In this context the Bureau expressed concern about the proposed high cost of data processing at Blue Plan/Regional Activity Centre and recommended that the possibility of using GRID System should be examined before other options (lease or purchase of self-contained data processing facility installed at Blue Plan/Regional Activity Centre) are considered.

5. It was pointed out by Mr A. Manos that the position of the internationally recruited secretary is still not filled and that this action is, with the consent of the Bureau, still in progress. In this connexion, the Bureau noted that the remaining General Service posts in the Unit, which are locally recruited, should be open in principle to nationals of all Mediterranean States.

Preparation for the Fourth Meeting of the Contracting Parties (Genoa, 9-13 September 1985)

6. Mr A. Manos briefed the Bureau on the Progress in the preparation of the Contracting Parties Meeting and on the basic documents which were prepared for the Meeting, drawing attention to the report of the Executive Director (UNEP/IG.56/3), in particular Annexes I and V.

7. While discussing the budget planned to be proposed for the 1986-87 period the Bureau considered that an annual increase of 8 percent in the overall budget could be realistic and justifiable. The Bureau recommended that the Secretariat consults with the Contracting parties prior to the Genoa Meeting in order to facilitate achievement of a consensus on the proposed budget.

8. The Bureau reviewed the draft declaration and a programme calendar to be proposed to the Genoa Meeting by the Executive Director (UNEP/IG.56/4) and offered comments on the draft.

Consultants' papers

9. The Bureau noted with appreciation that the documents on the achievements of the Mediterranean Action Plan in the last ten years and on the assessment of the pollution of the Mediterranean Sea have been prepared by consultants. The Bureau felt that the further review of these documents was not necessary and recommended the distribution of both documents without delay to the Contracting Parties as information documents for the Genoa Meeting, with the understanding that the documents will be identified as prepared by consultants in their personal capacity and as not necessarily reflecting the views of either UNEP or the Bureau.

Administration of Regional Activity Centres

10. The Bureau noted the information on the structure and cost of administrative support personnel in the framework of the Mediterranean Action Plan (Annex II). The Bureau expressed concern about the disparate ways in which such support is available at the level of various organizational units established or sponsored under the Action Plan and requested the secretariat to prepare a concrete recommendation to remedy the situation. In this context the Bureau reiterated that the resources of the Trust Fund should be primarily used for programme support and that in the Regional Activity Centres the administrative support should be mainly at expense of the host Governments.

Travel costs of Government Experts

11. In view of the difficulties of ensuring full participation in Working Group meetings the Bureau agreed that expenses should be covered for experts from all Contracting Parties attending such meetings, if so required.

"MEDWAVES", the Mediterranean Actions Plan's newsletter

12. The Bureau expressed its appreciation with the appearance of the first issue of "MEDWAVES" and encouraged the secretariat to continue its work. It noted that issues number 1 and 2 will be prepared in both English and French in time to be distributed at the Genoa Meeting.

Other business

13. The Bureau decided to hold its next meeting on 8 September 1985 in Genoa.

Adoption of the report

14. On 15 June 1985, the Bureau adopted its report.

from March to June 1985 and
Status of Mediterranean Action Plan
at 10 June 1985"

Meeting of the Governing Council of UNEP

1. The Chairman of the Bureau H.E. Mr Z. Kovacevic, the Rapporteur, Ms H. Baccar, and the Co-ordinator of the Mediterranean Action Plan, Mr A. Manos, attended the 13th Session of the Governing Council of UNEP (14-24 May 1985). The Council again expressed support for the Mediterranean programme.

Relation with the Host Country

2. A new Government was installed in Greece after the June 1985 election. H.E. Mr E. Kouloubis has been reappointed as Minister of Housing, Physical Planning and Environment.

3. The United Nations flag was raised for the first time at the Co-ordinating Unit Seat on 23 April 1985 after the completion of all official arrangements. United Nations Information Centres Directors participating in the Meeting of Information Centres (Athens, 23-25 April 1985) attended the ceremony.

Convention and Related protocols

4. On 15 April 1985, Italy gave its ratification to the Protocol on land-based sources by law number 128/1985, published in the Official Gazette of 15 April 1985. Total ratifications to-date: 9 (Algeria, Egypt, France, Italy, Monaco, Spain, Tunisia, Turkey, EEC).

Italy gave also its ratification to the Protocol on Specially Protected Areas by law number 127/1985, published in the Official Gazette of 15 April 1985. Total ratification to-date: 4 (Egypt, Italy, Tunisia, EEC). An up-to-date list of signatures and ratifications appears in Annex I.

Long-term programme for pollution monitoring and research (MED POL - Phase II)

6. The third Meeting of Working Group on Scientific and Technical Co-operation for MED POL (WGSTC) was held in Athens, 27-31 May 1985. Assessments of the present state of pollution of the Mediterranean Sea by Specific Pollutants (mercury, microbial and petroleum hydrocarbons) were reviewed and evaluated and respective recommendations were submitted to the Fourth Meeting of Contracting Parties for consideration.

7. Several participants at the WGSTC meeting stressed the difficulties encountered in collecting and reporting information on the sources and amounts of pollutants reaching the Mediterranean Sea from land-based sources. While recognizing the methodological difficulties involved, the secretariat drew the attention of the meeting to the fact that the adopted phase II of MED POL included, inter alia, reporting as provided for in Article 13 of the Land-Based Sources Protocol.

8. The WGSTC meeting was informed about the secretariat's plans to gather information relevant to the preparation of inventories of sources and amounts of pollutants from land-based sources, in order to respond to the needs of the Blue Plan and to the needs arising from the implementation of the Land-Based Sources Protocol. The problems related to the implementation of this activity were discussed, and as a result a country-visit programme was considered as an effective approach.

9. The Meeting recommended the establishment of ad-hoc Scientific Group on Dumping.

10. Within the framework of the research Component, the MED UNIT has received 42 new research proposals from 10 Mediterranean Coastal States Parties to the Barcelona Convention. These proposals are being processed.

11. The Third Meeting of Working Group on Scientific and Technical Co-operation for MED POL approved the proposed budget for 1986-1987 biennium and recommended for approval to the Contracting Parties a programme costing US\$ 1,950,000 for Monitoring and US\$ 650,000 for Research (UNEP/WG.118/9).

Maintenance and intercalibration

12. The Fourth intercalibration meeting on microbiological methods for Coastal Water Quality Monitoring was held in Split, 15-20 April 1985. Fifteen participants attended the meeting. Six of them were financed by the project.

Training

13. A Training Course on Petroleum Hydrocarbons is being organized at IAEA laboratory, Monaco from 3 to 28 June 1985.

Co-ordination

14. XVIII Meeting of the Inter-Agency Advisory Committee (IAAC) for MED POL was held in Athens on 26 May 1985. MED POL activities were reviewed and procedures for future actions were agreed upon (UNEP/IAAC-XVIII/2).

Integrated planning of the development and management of the resources of the Mediterranean Basin

15. A Joint Meeting of the National Focal Points of Blue Plan/Priority Actions Programme was held in Athens, 6-9 May 1985. National Focal Points from 13 Mediterranean Coastal States and EEC and four representatives from United Nations Organizations took part in the Meeting. Activities of Blue Plan/Priority Actions Programme for 1984-1985 and proposed workplan and budgets for 1986-1987 were discussed, as well as proposed fields and modalities of Co-operation between Blue Plan and Priority Actions Programme (UNEP/WG.129/8).

A. Blue Plan (BP)

16. The project document on the second phase of the Blue Plan for the year 1985 was signed between UNEP and the French Government in Nairobi on 14 March 1985.

17. The representative of France at the Joint Meeting of the Blue Plan/Priority Actions Programme National Focal Points (6-9 May 1985) confirmed the commitment of the French Government to the Blue Plan. This was attested by the letter from H.E. the Minister of Environment, Mme Bouchardeau to the Chairman of the Bureau of Mediterranean Action Plan, dated 3 May 1985. He also informed the meeting that Mr. M. Batisse has been designated as the president of the Blue Plan/Regional Activity Centre. Confirmation of the Host Country's continued support for 1986-1987 is required at the Genoa Meeting.

18. Letters were sent on 2 April 1985 to all Focal Points for Blue Plan inviting them to nominate candidates for the three posts of researchers for the permanent team of the Blue Plan Phase II. Few replies have been received. The selection of experts will be carried out during the next meeting of the Steering Committee (Sophia Antipolis, 3-4 July 1985).

19. The Joint Meeting of the Blue Plan/Priority Actions Programme National Focal Points (6-9 May 1985) recommended for approval to the Fourth Meeting of Contracting Parties a budget of 725,000 US dollars for 1986, and 630,000 US dollars for 1987 for the Blue Plan/Regional Activity Centre (UNEP/WG.129/8).

B. Priority Actions Programme (PAP)

20. During this period, Priority Actions Programme continued and intensified the activities initiated and launched in 1984 and 1985.

Directories of institutions and experts on human settlements, tourism and soil protection

21. The draft text of Directories was finalized. It will be submitted to the Priority Actions Programme National Focal Points before publishing for verification and eventual supplementing.

Rehabilitation and reconstruction of Mediterranean Historic Settlements

22. An Expert Meeting was held in Split, on 18-19 March 1985. A Seminar was held in Split, 22-24 May 1985. Twelve case studies were presented during the Seminar. The Meeting adopted general and specific recommendations in relation to the improvement of the State of historic settlements in the Mediterranean.

Land-use planning in Earthquake zones

23. An Expert Meeting was held in Split on 1-2 April 1985. It reviewed national reports and case study on the experience of SR Montenegro in physical planning for seismically active regions. The Meeting defined the structure of the Seminar planned for 27-29 June 1985 in Cetinje.

Soil Protection

24. Discussion between Priority Actions Programme/Regional Activity Centre and Food and Agricultural Organization on possible co-operation is underway on various aspects of soil protection in the Mediterranean.

Tourism

25. Invitations were sent to all Priority Actions Programme National Focal Points in February 1984 and again in April 1985 inviting them to take part in this action. It is expected that this action will help in creating necessary conditions for the formulation of recommendations for an active policy of environmentally sound development of tourism in the Mediterranean Basin.

Aquaculture

26. Two documents are being prepared, one on the choice and protection of sites suitable for aquaculture, and the other on the interrelations between the environment and the aquaculture. Priority Actions Programme/regional Activity Centre is considering with MEDRAP the possibilities of developing further joint activities.

Renewable Sources of Energy

27. Draft criteria for the selection of sites for potential pilot stations and for a Mediterranean solar energy centre have been formulated. Preparatory steps have been taken for the envisaged expert meeting to review programme documents and draft criteria and terms of references for the elaboration of two in-depth studies.

Budget

28. The Joint Meeting of the Blue Plan/Priority Actions Programme National Focal Points (6-9 May 1985) recommended for approval to the Fourth Meeting of the Contracting Parties, a budget of US\$ 549,000 for 1986 and US\$ 591,000 for the year 1987 for Priority Actions Programme/Regional activity Centre (UNEP/WG.129/8).

Regional Oil Combating Centre (ROCC)

29. The Centre continued its efforts for adoption of national contingency plans. Only seven countries have adopted such plans so far.

30. The Director of the Centre participated in the Meeting of Experts on Regional Arrangements for Co-operation in Combating Major Incidents of Marine Pollution, which was held in London, 29 April to 3 May 1985. The secretariat presented a paper to the Meeting entitled "Regional Arrangements for Co-operation in Combating Major Incidents of Marine Pollution in the Mediterranean Sea".

Preparation for the Fourth Meeting of Contracting Parties
(Genoa, 9-13 September 1985)

31. The Ambassador of Italy to Greece has signed at the seat of the Co-ordinating Unit on 9 May 1985, the Agreement between the Republic of Italy and the United Nations concerning the Fourth Meeting of Contracting Parties. The Agreement is to be signed by the Director-General of the European Office of the United Nations.

32. Mr A. Manos met twice (in March and June 1985) with Italian authorities (Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Ecology, Ministry of Public Health and Blue Plan Focal Point - Mr Ciarnelli and Priority Actions Programme Focal Point - Prof. Fierro and local authorities from Genoa) to review the preparations of the Genoa Meeting.

33. Mr S. Civili also had a meeting on 18 April 1985 at the office of the Regione Liguria in Genoa to discuss practical problems related to the organization of the meeting.

34. The draft text of the Evaluation of Mediterranean Action Plan in the first ten years has been reviewed and sent to the Bureau members and the Executive Director and Dr Keckes on 5th May.

35. The draft text of the Assessment of the Pollution of the Mediterranean Sea, prepared by Consultants, was reviewed by the secreteriat.

36. The draft text of a Declaration on the Occasion of the 10th Anniversary of Mediterranean Action Plan was prepared by the secreteriat and sent to the Bureau members, and to the Executive Director and Dr Keckes on 5 May 1985.

37. The draft report of the Executive Director on 1984-1985 and proposed programme and budget for 1986-1987 was completed.

38. A high level group will meet to review the Evaluation and Assessment documents with the presence of the Executive Director in Geneva on 11-12 July 1985.

39. A study on the relevant provisions of the Law of the Sea Convention, in particular those constituting customary international law, and their bearing on the Co-operation of the States in the framework of the Mediterranean Action Plan and the Barcelona Convention, was prepared by a consultant (Prof. B. Vukas). The study will be presented to the Genoa Meeting.

Meetings organized and attended

41. The Co-ordinator attended the expert meeting on regional arrangements for co-operation in combating major incidents of marine pollution, London 29 April - 3 May 1985.
42. Mr L. Jeftic, Senior Marine Scientist, attended the meeting of the Board of the International Conference on pollution in the Mediterranean (17-18 April), and discussed with concerned authorities in Yugoslavia of their participation in MED POL.
43. The co-ordinator attended the Conference of Regions of the Mediterranean Basin, Marseilles (27-29 March 1985) organized by the Council of Europe, in co-operation with the French Government and the region Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur. He made a statement on behalf of UNEP.
44. At the invitation of the Minister of Fisheries and Merchant Marine of Morocco, the Co-ordinator attended the Round Table, which was held on 3 May 1985, at which two draft books (No. 2 on Fisheries and No. 3 on Marine Environment Protection) were presented and discussed. The Unit has assisted Morocco through an expert mission. The positive result achieved has encouraged the Ministry of Interior to start work on a code of environmental protection on land.
45. Mr I. Dharat, Programme Officer, visited Headquarters (Nairobi) in March 1985 for briefing.
46. Mr I. Dharat, Programme Officer, attended the Seminar on Human Settlements (Split, 22-24 May 1985) representing the Secretariat.
47. Mr S. Civili, Marine Scientist, was on mission on 12 April 1985 in Italy in relation with the finalization of the Italian national monitoring programme.
48. The Meeting of Directors of United Nations Information Centres on the Mediterranean Action Plan was held at the seat of the Co-ordinating Unit in Athens from 23 to 25 April 1985. Directors of Information Centres serving all Mediterranean countries participated actively in the Meeting. They heard briefing on Mediterranean Action Plan components from MED Unit staff. Directors made their comments and suggestions on how to improve communication flow and offered their centres as channels of information. The report of the meeting was issued as document UNEP/WG.132/3.
49. Mr L. Jeftic, Senior Marine Scientist, attended the Meeting (Paris, 15 May 1985) on the ICSEM-IOC-UNEP/MEDU relations and discussed obligations for past (Luzerne) and future (Baleari) meetings.
50. Mr L. Jeftic, Senior Marine Scientist, attended the Meeting (Paris, 15 May 1985) on the IOC-UNEP/MEDU relations.
51. Mr L. Jeftic, Senior Marine Scientist, attended the Seventh Meeting of the Convention for the Prevention of Marine Pollution from Land-based sources of the Paris Commission (Bruxelles, 3-5 June 1985).

52. The list of 1984 and 1985 meetings convened in the framework of Mediterranean Action Plan is attached as Annex III.

Staff matters

53. Ms Martine Foerter-Platis has been given recruited on a one year contract as bilingual secretary.

Other matters

54. The MED Unit financed four participants from Algeria, Israel and Turkey to attend UNEP/IMO Expert Meeting on regional arrangements for co-operation in combating major incidents of marine pollution (London, 29 April - 3 May 1985).

55. Ms M. Conlon, Acting Chief, Personnel Section, UNEP Headquarters, Nairobi, visited the MED Unit on 29 April 1985 and gave a briefing to all staff on Performance Evaluation Report System as well as discussing general and personal administrative questions.
