A SPOTLIGHT ON RESEARCH & EDUCATION

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

This newsletter has a special emphasis on research and education.

Education is a key element in changing perspectives and attitudes towards nature and lifestyles. In Christianity, while education is not specifically mentioned in the Bible, it is reflected in as part of the moral and spiritual obligations of knowledge of believers of his God and his creation. Similarly, in the Holy Quran, the importance of education is repeatedly emphasized such as "God will exalt those of you who believe and those who have knowledge to high degrees". In Hinduism, education is to achieve revelation or Brahman (divine consciousness).

From a sustainable development point of view, education is essential to promoting development of the knowledge, skills, understanding, values, and actions required to create a sustainable world. We are delighted that we are launching several initiatives on research on ecology and religion, launching training courses and developing some publications.

The International Dialogue Centre (KAICIID) together with the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) Faith for Earth, University of Peace (UPEACE), Lutheran World Federation (LWF), National Muslim Council of Liberia (NMCL), and Institut Superior de Ciències Religioses de Barcelona (ISCREB) unveiled a new e-learning course designed to help religious leaders and faith-based organisations (FBOs) achieve greater engagement and contribute to the implementation process of the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).


<u>This course</u> — Engaging Faith Actors to Support the Implementation Process of the Sustainable Development Goals — was launched during the <u>Faith for Earth Dialogue</u> at the United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA).

It is a free e-learning and training course is formed of seven modules, each offering faith leaders, religious groups, faith-based organisations and other stakeholders a distinct approach to effectively engage and contribute to the process of sustainable development in the communities they serve through different methodologies, models, tools, and other approaches.
