Est. Nov 2018 by CBD COP14, Decision 14/34

Mandate: Prepare framework to succeed Aichi Targets for adoption at COP15

### Key Elements of the Framework

**Set out** an ambitious plan to transform society's relationship with biodiversity

**Fulfill,** by 2050, the shared vision of living in harmony with nature is fulfilled.

Galvanize action by governments and society

**Contribute** to the 2030 agenda for sustainable development

**Build** on a 'Theory of Change' recognizing the need for urgent policy action globally, regionally & nationally

**Goals** for 2050 that are related to the 2050 Vision for Biodiversity.

Milestones to assess progress in 2030

**Means & know-how:** Financing and support for implementation, building capacity, etc.

**Coordination**: A whole-of-government and society approach

**Tracking action:** Planning, monitoring, reporting & review

**Engaging stakeholders worldwide:** Create a true framework for all.

Background, Purpose, Relationship to SDGs, and the Theory of Change (Sections A to D)

2050 Vision and 2030 mission (Section E)

Goals and Milestones (Section F)

Goal A: Integrity of all ecosystems is enhanced

**Goal B:** Nature's contributions to people are valued, maintained, or enhanced

**Goal C:** Benefits from the utilization of genetic resources are shared fairly and equitably

**Goal D:** Close the gap between the available financial resources and the means of implementation – and what's needed.

2030 Action Targets (Section G)

The **2050 Vision** is a world living in harmony with nature

The **2030 Mission** is to take urgent action across society to put biodiversity on a path to recovery by 2030

**Targets for urgent action** over the decade to 2030. The actions need immediate implementation and completion by 2030.

Together, the results will enable achievement of the 2030 milestones and the goals for 2050.

Actions to reach these targets should be in harmony with the CBD and its Protocols.

#### Digital Sequence Information (DSI)

A key issue related to the GBF focused on the rules for sharing DSI benefits at the international level to ensure both equity and the continuance of DSI research



## WG2020-3: Facts and Figures

- Met virtually 23 August to 3 September 2021 (part I)
- Met in person in Geneva from 14 to 27 March 2022 (part II)
- Part II held concurrently with SBSTTA-24 and SBI-3
- More than 1900 registered participants (part II), almost 1400 in person (among the most highly attended to date)
- 151 Parties and more than 300 CSOs + other stakeholders
- 10 plenary sessions (parts I+II), interspersed with contact groups for detailed negotiation based on the First Draft of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework









## WG2020-3: Outcomes (I)

The following recommendations were adopted:

- 3/1: Preparation of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework
  - contains the draft text of the framework as negotiated in Geneva
- 3/2: Digital sequence information on genetic resources
  - provides a concrete list of areas for further consideration;
     preliminary elements of a draft decision for COP15.2 in annex

3/3: Preparation of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework: fourth meeting of the Working Group

The full text of these recommendations is contained in the meeting report of WG2020-3 (part II) in document CBD/WG2020/3/7.

The Fourth meeting of the Working Group (WG2020-4) is scheduled to take place from 21-26 June 2022 in Nairobi, Kenya.

## WG2020-4: Expectations

- WG2020-4 will pick up where it left off in Geneva both for agenda items 4 (post-2020 GBF) and 5 (digital sequence information - DSI)
- Produce negotiated draft text with as few brackets as possible for adoption at COP15

 To date, 2100 participants have pre-registered for WG2020-4 of which 1000 are for on-site and 1100 for virtual participation (from 146 Parties, 232 observer organizations)



## WG2020-4: Registration

To participate in WG2020-4, CPR representatives require:

- 1) Accreditation (nomination letter)
- 2) Priority pass (register online)
- 3) Daily negative COVID test (test kits provided)
- 4) CBD badge + sticker (from security that verifies negative COVID test)

In addition, to access WG2020-4 plenaries, CPR representatives need a **secondary badge** (only two per country, given at registration). Plenary proceedings can be watched in overflow room without secondary badge.
