



































Fiji extraction site overview






- Hard rock quarry River extraction





<u>Current</u> <u>Monitoring</u>


Enhanced Monitoring







- ✓ Monitor Fiji's rivers at the national scale using satellite data.
- ✓ Detect changes indicating potential areas of illegal extraction.
- ✓ Support Govt to efficiently allocate limited human resources.
- **✓** Support Govt to enforce regulations.
- ✓ Deterrence: "eye in the sky".
