



The United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA) serves as the principal global environmental forum, bringing together representatives universal Membership of United Nations Member States, as well as Major Groups and Stakeholders, to address pressing environmental challenges.

On Wednesday March 2nd 2022, in Nairobi, the Kingdom of Morocco was elected, by acclamation, President of the 6th United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA-6), for a two-year term. UNEA-6 is scheduled to take place from 26 February to the 1st March 2024 at UNEP Headquarters, in Nairobi, Kenya.





CONTEXT

During a joint meeting of the Bureau of UNEA-6 and the Committee of Permanent Representatives, held on 30 January 2023, the Bureau of the Environment Assembly decided that the theme for UNEA-6 will be defined as follows (See Annex 1):

"Effective, inclusive, and sustainable multilateral actions to tackle climate change, biodiversity loss, and pollution."

A Joint Retreat of the UNEA-6 Bureau and the CPR Bureau will take place from 6 to 7 of July in Tangiers, Morocco. In this context and in alignment with the urgent and demanding challenges of the interconnected environmental crisis, an International Major Groups and Stakeholders Meeting, co organized by the Mohammed VI Foundation for Environmental Protection and the United Nations Environment Programme, will take place at the Hassan II International Center for Environmental Training Center, in Rabat, Morocco on July 4th and 5th (See Annex 2).

The meeting will be hybrid in nature and thus participants that are not able to be present in person can join the meeting online through Online Links.

In alignment with its commitment to youth, the Mohammed VI Foundation for Environmental Protection is co-organizing with the UNEP Major Group for Children and Youth a Pre-UNEA 6 Youth consultation on July 3rd, at the Hassan II International Center for Environmental Training, to provide opportunities for youth to encourage their active engagement, voice their opinions, and identify their priorities. The meeting will also be hybrid and participants that can't be present in person are welcome to join remotely.

MAIN THEMES

The UNEA-6 (United Nations Environment Assembly) is a global meeting that focuses on addressing pressing environmental issues and promoting sustainable development. The sixth session of the UNEA, known as UNEA-6, is expected to place significant emphasis on three key themes: climate change, biodiversity, and pollution. Here's an overview of each theme:

Climate Change: Climate change remains one of today's most critical challenges. UNEA-6 aims to raise awareness, promote action, and enhance international cooperation to mitigate the impacts of climate change. Discussions at the meeting may cover topics such as greenhouse gas emissions reduction, renewable energy promotion, adaptation strategies, and the implementation of the Paris Agreement. It aims to encourage countries to strengthen their commitments towards combating climate change and accelerating the transition to a low-carbon economy.

Biodiversity Conservation: Biodiversity loss is another urgent environmental concern. UNEA-6 preparatory meeting provides a platform to highlight the importance of conserving and sustainably managing biodiversity to ensure the well-being of ecosystems and human societies.

This gathering will bring more focus on addressing challenges of air pollution, water pollution, soil contamination, and waste management. The meeting may explore ways to reduce pollution through the implementation of sustainable production and consumption patterns, the promotion of circular economy approaches, the strengthening of environmental regulations, and the advancement of innovative technologies.

April 2023	 Circulation of a zero draft ministerial declaration inviting Member States, observers and major groups and stakeholders to provide written inputs by the end of May 2023.
10 May 2023	Preliminary discussion on the zero draft at the UNEA and CPR joint Bureaux meeting.
End of May 2023	Deadline for the submission of inputs on the zero draft.
Mid-June 2023	 First informal consultations with Member States, observers and major groups and stakeholders on the zero draft, under the leadership of UNEA Presidency and in the margins of the 162nd CPR meeting, with in-person and online participation.
6 July 2023	 Informal exchange of views with major groups and stakeholders on the preparations for UNEA, including consultations on the zero draft ministerial declaration. Meeting to be held in the form of a 2-hour event in advance of the UNEA and CPR joint Bureaux retreat.
6-7 July 2023	 Further consideration of the zero draft at the UNEA and CPR joint Bureaux retreat in Morocco, with the objective to provide further guidance to the Presidency on the zero draft.
End of July 2023	 Circulation of the first draft ministerial declaration inviting Member States, observers and major groups and stakeholders to provide written inputs and comments by the end of August 2023.
End of Aug 2023	Deadline for the submission of inputs on the first draft.
Mid-Sept 2023	 Circulation of the revised first draft ministerial declaration on the basis of inputs and contributions received.
	 Second informal consultations with Member States, observers and major groups and stakeholders on the revised first draft ministerial declaration, under the leadership of UNEA Presidency, with in-person and online participation.
End of September	 Circulation of the second draft ministerial declaration inviting Member States, observers and major groups and stakeholders to provide written inputs and comments by mid-October 2023.

End Oct 2023	Deadline for the submission of inputs on the second draft.
Early Nov 2023	 Circulation of the revised second draft ministerial declaration inviting Member States observers and major groups and stakeholders to provide inputs and comments at the 10st meeting of the annual subcommittee of the CPR (ASC-10).
End of Nov 2023	 Consultations with Member States, observers and major groups and stakeholders at the ASC- 10 under the leadership of the UNEA Presidency.
Jan 2024 ²	 Circulation of the final draft ministerial declaration for consideration at the 6th meeting of the Open-ended Committee of Permanent Representatives (OECPR-6).
19-23 Feb 2024	 Consultations at the OECPR-6 led by the UNEA Presidency, with in-person and online participation.
29 Feb / 1 March 2024	 Adoption by consensus of the draft ministerial declaration during the high-level segment of UNEA-6.
