INTRODUCTION

SWITCH Africa Green programme is designed to support 7 countries (Burkina Faso, Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Mauritius, South Africa and Uganda) in Africa to achieve sustainable development by engaging in transition towards an inclusive green economy, based on sustainable consumption and production (SCP) patterns. The programme aims to turn environmental challenges into opportunities based on the understanding that an inclusive green economy is at the core of sustainable development and has multiple benefits next to environmental protection, notably growth and jobs creation, poverty reduction, economic diversification, and income generation. The programme focuses on key enablers for the transition, including access to green financing, enabling policies and standards, circular practices, awareness and skills on eco-entrepreneurship, and innovative solutions.

Since its inception, SWITCH Africa Green has built a pool of resources, knowledge base and expertise within the four priority sectors: agriculture, integrated waste management, manufacturing and tourism sectors. The transition to an inclusive green economy requires scaling up on the cooperation and collaborations among countries as well as creating synergies with emerging trends to achieve the objectives — such as circular economy approaches and exploring a workable mechanism for access to finance for green investments among others.

Circular Economy approaches will moreover be part of Africa's transformative efforts to ensure green business development. The SWITCH Africa Green programme promotes circularity approaches through the promotion of biogas technology, E-waste management, promoting organic agriculture, green manufacturing and eco-industrial park and standards, and labelling in the hotel industry, among others.

Implementation of the SWITCH Africa Green programme is also guided by global regional settings and priorities. During the 17th session of the African Ministerial Conference on the Environment (AMCEN) in Durban, South Africa, a regional framework on circular economy was proposed and reiterated - to focus on contextualizing the circular economy to the needs of African countries. The AMCEN session identified the circular economy as one of the areas where action needs to be taken to promote environmental sustainability and prosperity in Africa. The discussions specifically highlighted the importance of contextualizing the circular economy to the needs and resource profiles of African countries and, on that basis, of developing a regional programme to promote and scale up the circular economy in the region. What is currently missing, and which informs the AMCEN decision, is to scale up and replicate the efforts across the continent in a more organised approach.

Circular economy approaches galvanize and spur green investments, partnerships and continued innovation. To this end, a system-wide approach and behavioural change is required to transition towards a more circular economy. This entails countries having very strong political messaging systems, awareness and capacity development programmes to drive the circular economy agenda. It also requires galvanising public and private financing mechanisms to ensure access to capital for firms of all sizes and a critical mass of people with the capacity to implement the circular economy principles.

With the foregoing, SWITCH Africa Green is organising a regional meeting to discuss the avenues and approaches to implementing circular economy and scaling up circular economy approaches in Africa. Further, the regional meeting is the culmination of the Switch Africa Green Programme's Phase 1 and 2 as the final meeting to close the programme that has been instrumental in supporting the transition of Africa to Sustainable Consumption and Production patterns.

ABOUT THE REGIONAL MEETING:

The regional meeting is organized by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), in collaboration with the **Ministry of Environment, Solid Waste Management and Climate Change, Mauritius.**

The forum will bring various stakeholders from the SWITCH Africa Green partner countries and other stakeholders involved in promoting an inclusive green economy and circular economy such as policy makers, business associations, private sector, financial institutions, regional economic communities, international development organisations and partners, and civil society organisations. The main objectives of the meeting are: -

- To enhance regional efforts to scale up green and circular business approaches and inspire continued national level policy making and implementation.
- To stimulate discussions on importance of circular economy in driving sustainable development.
- To discuss the opportunities and challenges of adopting circularity in Africa

- To disseminate the launched 'Guidelines to Accelerate the Transition Towards a Circular Economy in Africa' as a robust tool to drive implementation of circular economy in Africa.
- To consolidate the SAG phase 1 and 2 impacts and explore avenues of upscaling and replicating similar interventions in Africa.

Exhibition:

There will be an exhibition to showcase the Switch Africa Green Programme Phase 1 and 2 innovative interventions in the four Sectors of manufacturing, agriculture, tourism, integrated waste management and the cross-cutting sectors of energy efficiency, water efficiency, standards and labelling among others. The exhibition will also showcase innovations from other green business and circularity interventions in other countries in Africa.
