- Written submissions on the OEWG 2 documents will be welcomed from Member States and stakeholders once documents have been posted to the website on 31 October 2023
 - Deadline for receiving submissions will be 24 November 2023
 - Submissions will be posted to OEWG 2 site
- Specific briefings/informal consultations on Saturday, 9 December and Sunday, 10 December 2023.
 - The aim is to inform discussions throughout the rest of the week and where relevant make a start with initial exchange on specific issues.
 - An up-to-date programme with more detail will be made available to participants on the OEWG 2 site

Agenda Item 4: Preparation of proposals

- Regional and political groups and the group of stakeholders may provide general views and overarching perspectives on the preparations of proposals for the establishment of a science-policy panel
- Secretariat will be invited to briefly present the meeting documents,
- After the introduction of each document, Member States will be invited to consider the specific topics and proposals outlined in the documents.
- At the end of Member State interventions on each working document, stakeholders will also be invited to provide their views.
- The exchange in plenary will form the basis to establish contact groups that will be provided with specific mandates

Contact Groups: Proposed Approach

- Contact groups will be established with a specific mandate to work towards proposals on specific topics
- Contact groups will work in 1.5 hour timeslots
- Aim to have iterative process during the week to make as much progress as possible at OEWG2.
- Starting on Day 3 (Wednesday), stock-taking plenary sessions will be held every morning for updates on progress and if needed take further decisions on the organization of work.
- Informal dialogues on specific topics may be convened as necessary.
- In the interest of time, it may be possible that a contact group may run in parallel to Plenary.
- The contact groups and possible informal dialogues will have very clear and concise mandates such that participants have an opportunity to discuss in detail specific topics in order to develop proposals.

Contact Groups: Proposed Topics

- Depending on progress in plenary, contact groups may be mandated to consider proposals on:
 - i. scope and objective and functions
 - ii. operating principles
 - iii. institutional arrangements and Rules of Procedure
 - iv. relationships with relevant key stakeholders
 - v. work-related processes and procedures (work programme, receiving and prioritizing requests/submissions, engaging experts, review and adoption of reports)
 - vi. conflict of interest procedures
- An informal group may be mandated to consider.
 - budget and organization of the future work of the OEWG
- Additional contact groups / informal groups may be established on as needed basis.

Content of webinar

- Reflection and overview of OEWG 1 and on the way to OEWG 2
- Practicalities of the MGS engagement and participation (accreditation/seating arrangements, preparatory meetings)
- Good practices during OEWG 1 on Civil society day and coordination meetings among MGS and in the morning from the Secretariat as well as invited MGS representatives
- Science and Technology MG organization
- Youth MG coordination, capacity building, webinars and coordinated statements
- The importance of capacity building to bridge the gap between youth and the SPP. In this capacity
 the CYMG is organizing capacity building series to attract youth attention to the OEWG policy and
 process.
- The youth MG approach was considered worthwhile to be mirrored by other MGs possibly.



Content of webinar (cont.)

- Reflections on importance of the regional consultations that took place and how crucial the grassroots experience can be to provide valuable inputs.
- Additional suggestions made by the invited panelists, was to ensure to link MGS engagement in OEWG 2 to other processes, such as ICCM5 but also any other preparatory sessions
- It was emphasised to build synergies between different MEAs and cross-share information on all different meetings and decisions.
- MGS participants appreciated the secretariat for creating the stakeholder engagement document and encouraged it to also look at different platforms that might be relevant.
- MGS also requested to ensuring that stakeholders are represented in decision-making spaces as the different groups have very different lived experiences and it is important to have them heard.

- Accreditation information
- Engagement channels
- Contact information of focal points of MGS coordinators
- Written submissions by MGS prior to the OEWG 2
 - Scope, how to submit, and deadline
- It was also suggested that the Secretariat but also MGS might take advantage of other relevant meetings such as next week's CBD meeting to offer information events or side events which are another possible avenue for MGS engagement and preparation


