



The Environmental Management Group

- ➤ A UN system-wide coordination body on environment and human settlements.
- ➤ Established in 2001 as a response to the General Assembly **resolution 53/242** in July 1999. The resolution supported the proposal of the Secretary-General to establish an environmental management group contained in his report on the **Environment and Human Settlements** (A/53/463).
- Has a membership of 52 UN entities and 3 observing bodies.
- ➤ Identifies issues on the international environmental agenda that warrant UN system-wide collaboration, and finds ways to engage its collective capacity to create holistic responses to those issues.
- ➤ Operates through leading a variety of technical meetings, Issue Management Groups and task forces. Additionally, the EMG assists UN entities in addressing environmental issues by creating topic guides in the form of Common Approaches.

1. UN Common Approach to Biodiversity

Common Approach to Integrating Biodiversity and Naturebased Solutions for Sustainable Development into United Nations Policy and Programme Planning and Delivery

A normative framework, in a result-based structure, to organize collective action and joint delivery in support to the implementation of the Kunming-Montreal Biodiversity Framework.

Implementation in UN Development System reported to member states via the Quadrennial Comprehensive Policy Review – QCPR










The Common Approach on Biodiversity contributes to and act as a tool for GBF implementation.




