UNEA was established in June 2012 as a result of the United Nations Conference on Sustainable Development, also known as Rio+20. The outcome document, **The Future We Want**, called on the UN General Assembly to strengthen and upgrade UNEP. The UNGA then adopted resolution 67/213 on strengthening and upgrading UNEP and establishing universal membership of its Governing Council. In March 2013, the UNGA further adopted resolution 67/251, which changed the designation of the UNEP Governing Council to the UNEA.

UNEA-6 Ministerial Declaration

The **roadmap** for the consultation on the UNEA-6 ministerial declaration was shared in April 2023.

The "zero draft" was circulated on 5 May

The first informal consultations on the zero draft was held 20 June

The "first draft" was circulated on 17 August, with an invitation for written input by 29 September

The second informal consultations was held on 26 September

The "second draft" of the ministerial declaration will be circulated at the end of October.

The Third informal consultations will be on 8 November

Supplementary Agenda Item: Cooperation with MEAs 28 February 2024

Objective: The UNEA-6 theme provides a structured entry point to highlight the importance of cooperation with MEAs.

- Strengthen the engagement of MEAs in UNEA-6 to promote coherence between UNEA resolutions and decisions of MEA governing bodies whilst fully respecting the autonomy of MEAs.
- Enhance UNEA's relationship with MEAs to contribute to the implementation of the 2030 Agenda. Strengthening convergence of action and dialogue on common strategies and sharing of experiences while providing increased visibility to the decisions of MEAs governing bodies.
- Expected to result in tangible outcomes reflected as appropriate, in resolutions and conclusions of the meeting.

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Thematic focus of the high-level dialogues

The MEAs high level dialogues will be held on 28th February from 10:00 am to 1:00pm and from 3:00pm to 6:00pm;

- Dialogue 1: Strengthening science-policy interface for effective implementation of environmental commitments.
- Dialogue 2: Strengthening cooperation between UNEA, UNEP and MEAs to enhance effective implementation at the national level including through means of implementation.

Participation in the MEAs day

- Open to all UNEA participants.
- UNEP administered MEAs, UNCCD, UNFCCC, non-UNEP administered MEAs of the Liaison Group of Biodiversity related Conventions and others as appropriate.
- The panelists and introductory speakers will be determined later but several ministers who also serve as COP Presidents will play a role.



MEAs exhibitions and related events

- MEAs exhibition will be organized during the whole week of UNEA-6 to showcase cooperation between UNEP and MEAs, other UN entities and MEAs as well as among the MEAs on cross-cutting topics of interest which are relevant to the theme of UNEA-6
- MEAs related events will be held in two dedicated tents from 28th February to 1st March 2024.

National statements

High-level segment: Thursday, 29 February and Friday, 1 March 2024

Statements by Member States

- All Member States will have to an opportunity to deliver one national statement during the high-level segment.
- National statements are expected to be delivered in-person.
- Exceptionally, **pre-recorded video** messages could be provided by Heads of State and Government who will not be able to attend in person. These pre-recorded video messages would be played in the plenary.
- Pre-recorded video messages at ministerial-level or below would be uploaded on the website but not played in the meeting room and not reflected in the meeting report.

Statements by observers: Time permitting, observers will be able to deliver statements in person.



National statements (2)

High-level segment: Thursday, 29 February and Friday, 1 March 2024

Upcoming guidelines on inscription process:

- List of speakers will be established on a first-come first served basis, with the customary protocol.
- Time limit of 3 minutes for individual statements and 5 minutes for statements made on behalf of a group of States

E-delegate portal will be used for delegations to inscribe on the list of speakers.

Structure and format

- Open to all registered participants
- Held fully in person and webcast on UNWebTV
- Interpretation provided in the six official languages
- Opening of each dialogue by the President of UNEA, followed by a brief statement by the Executive Director of UNEP
- 2 keynote speakers will set the scene no panel discussion given the limited time (90 minutes).
- Professional moderator(s) will be hired to conduct the dialogues
- No pre-established list of speakers for the "interactive discussion" in order to allow for a dialogue and to accommodate as many speakers as possible



Structure and format (2)

- Accommodates 69 speakers in total combining the 3 LDs: 45 Member States,
 9 IGOs and UN system entities and 9 NGOs
- Delegations will express their interest to speak in the room by pressing the microphone button
- Effort will be made to respect the protocol by giving priority to any Head of State or Government
- Effort will also be made to intersperse participants from IGOs, UN system and NGOs among Member States
- Time limit of 2 minutes with a countdown timer displayed on the screen
- The summary of the three leadership dialogues will be presented at the last plenary meeting on 1 March 2024 and will be included in the proceedings report.



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



- The original hard copy of the credentials and other communications should be submitted to the Law Division of UNEP or by mail to P.O. Box 30552, 00100 Nairobi, Kenya, for the attention of the UNEP Principal Legal Adviser.
