Further to the <u>invitation letter</u> of the Executive Secretary dated 20 October 2023, we have the honor to inform you that the application deadline for travel support to participate in the fourth session of the intergovernmental negotiating committee to develop an international legally binding instrument on plastic pollution, including in the marine environment (INC-4), has been extended to a final deadline of **12**January 2024, 23:59 East Africa Time . No requests after 12 January 2024 will be accommodated.

To facilitate the participation of accredited observers from non-governmental organizations in INC-4, the INC Secretariat is in the position to provide travel support for the participation of **a total of 20 observers from NGOs**. For more information on the application process, please consult Annex A attached.

Please be informed that the registration for INC-4 and the application for travel support are two separate processes and delegates **must have their registration to INC-4 approved** prior to the submission of the funding requests.

Annex A. Application for travel support from observers from non-governmental organizations

To facilitate the participation of accredited observers from non-governmental organizations at the third session of the Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee (INC-3) the INC Secretariat is in the position to provide travel support for the participation of a maximum of 20 observers from non-governmental organization.

Please be informed that **only delegates whose registration for INC-4** has been approved can apply for **travel support**. Registration for INC-4 and application for travel support are two separate processes, and no application will be processed via email.

The funding, made available through voluntary contributions from donors, will cover, in accordance with the United Nations rules and regulations:

- Economy-class round-trip air tickets,
- Daily subsistence allowance (DSA), and
- Terminal expenses.

For the provision of travel support:

- The applicant must present the UN event ticket demonstrating that the registration for INC-4 has been approved.
- Only participants from developing countries and from economies in transition are eligible for funding, with priority given to observers from <u>Least Developed Countries</u> (LDCs) and <u>Small</u> <u>Island Developing States</u> (SIDS).
- Priority will be given to participants from non-governmental organizations nominated on behalf of constituencies representing, inter alia, children and youth, women, indigenous peoples, Environmental NGOs, persons with disabilities, local authorities, scientific and technological community, business and industry, farmers, workers and trade unions, including waste pickers and workers from the informal and cooperative settings, and large coalitions of non-governmental organizations.
- Only one participant per organization will be considered for funding. If more than one application is received from the same organization, only the first applicants will be considered.

The deadline for application/recommendation is 8 December 2023.

Applicants are invited to submit application through Indico: <u>Application for travel support for non-governmental observers.</u>

While making the selection, due regard should be given also to:

- Equitable geographic distribution
- Gender parity
- Proven expertise on the subject matter

The INC Secretariat, in consultation with the Bureau of the INC, will ensure that the criteria listed above are followed.

Annex C - Visa application guide

Applying for an entry visa to Canada

- 1. Please see whether you require a visa or an eTA to travel to Canada. You can find this information here: Find out if you need a visa to travel to Canada (cic.gc.ca)
- 2. Once the registration to INC-4 is duly approved, participants will receive an automatic message from INDICO with the UN Event pass and a confirmation letter that is to be used as a visa support letter. Please note this letter is mandatory as part of the Temporary Resident Visa (TRV) application process. INC-4 attendees who have a registration confirmation letter are exempt from visa and biometric processing fees as described below.
- 3. The confirmation letter will be issued with an **IRCC Special Event Code** that you must include for application when applying for the visa for it to be tagged appropriately.
- 4. Unless you are a visa-exempt visitor, you are required to apply online for your TRV.
- 5. Participants must use the following method to apply for the visa to enter Canada.

STEP 1




STEP 3

After you sign in, click on "Apply to come to Canada" to start an application:


STEP 4

Please click on "Visitor visa, study and/or work permit" button:



STEP 5

Follow the online questionnaire to identify yourself and to determine eligibility to apply for visa.




STEP 6

Once eligibility to apply for visa has been confirmed, please click on the "Continue" to proceed to the next process.



Step 7

When asked whether you will be paying fees with your application or whether you meet and exemption, please select "No, I am exempt from paying fees for this application". Note that you must still obtain a visa and provide biometrics (if applicable) but you will not be charged any fees.




STEP 8

You will need to answer series of questions, which includes details about your travel. Please make sure to answer all required fields.

STEP 9

You will be prompted to complete the "Application for Visitor Visa (Temporary Resident Visa) Made Outside of Canada (IMM5257)" form. Under the 'Details of visit to Canada' section of the form, select "Other" from the "Purpose of my visit" dropdown and in the free text box, type "INC-4" and the Special Event Code (6-digit code found on the visa letter):



You will then be prompted to provide various supporting documents, including proof of how you meet the fee exemption. The 'proof' you must upload is the registration confirmation letter received from the Secretariat which contains the **Special Event Code** assigned by Canadian authorities.

STEP 10

Once your application has been submitted, please use the Secretariat portal for visa information made available upon confirmation of your registration to <u>provide the INC Secretariat your visa application</u> <u>number</u> and some personal data to assist in speeding up the process.

Please provide your Full Name (as in passport) and Visa Application number.

For BIOMETRICS

If you need to provide biometrics, you will be issued a Biometric Instruction Letter (BIL) after you submit your Temporary Resident Visa application and are required to report to the nearest <u>Visa Application Centre</u> to provide this information in person. <u>Biometrics are only required from individuals once every ten years</u> so if you have already provided biometrics to Canada in that period, please note that you will be exempt from this step.

IMPORTANT:

- 1: You cannot make an appointment for biometrics until you receive a BIL.
- 2: The processing of your visa application will not begin until biometrics are provided.
