



#### Introduction (1/3)

Definition

The country has mechanisms in place for aligning priorities, policies and plans across the various levels of government





#### Introduction (2/3)

#### Implementation

- Can be stimulated through the organization of peer-learning sessions and the sharing of good practices, for example:
  - City networks, twinning exercises, study visits, webinars and direct collaboration on different topics
- Another way is to ensure links between the voluntary national reviews and the increasing number of subnational reviews (voluntary local reviews)



### Introduction (3/3)

Why is the consultation and coordination across government levels important?


- The aim of this mechanism is to ensure that policies, plans, and programmes at all levels of government (national and sub-national) are aligned and mutually supportive
- In the absence of such alignment:
  - Key aspects of national strategies or plans may not be adequately implemented at the sub-national or local levels
  - The reality and priorities at a lower governmental level may not be taken into account





#### Country example

Indonesia



- Presidential Decree No. 59 of 2017 formally requires the integration of the SDGs and the national medium-term development plan into medium-term regional and local plans
  - Also calls for the preparation of a road map for implementation of the SDGs and other action plans, annual reports and biannual monitoring systems at the subnational level
- To ensure that the subnational levels bought into the process, the national government developed a <u>series of communication strategies</u>, <u>technical guidelines and a set of metadata indicators</u>

# **6.1** Mechanisms to systematically collect the inputs of sub-national government entities

Country example: Belgium



- The <u>Inter-Ministerial Conference for Sustainable Development</u> is a multilevel panel that comprises federal, regional and community ministers responsible for sustainable development
  - Used as a central coordination mechanism for policy coherence for sustainable development at all levels
- In addition, all sustainable development actions undertaken at the local level are recorded by the <u>Advisory Council for Policy Coherence for Sustainable Development</u> and openly displayed online

## **6.2** Arrangements for regular formal exchange between central government and subnational levels

Country example: Burkina Faso



- National Economic and Social Development Plan entails the implementations and monitoring system of the SDGs and envisions cooperation between the national and local levels
- Under the National Steering Committee for the Plan, 13 regional committees have been created
  - Ensure regular dialogue at the regional level
  - Ensure the timely and concrete follow-up of the regional and local development plans and annual assessments
  - > Enable engagement at the subnational level for vertical and horizontal policy coherence

# **6.3** Mechanisms to ensure enhanced substantive coherence (templates & checklists)

Country example: Norway



- <u>Association of Local and Regional Authorities</u> is a national members' association for municipalities, counties, and public enterprises under municipal or county ownership
- Enables <u>consultative meetings</u> between the local and central authorities at both the political and the administrative levels, which aim to provide a forum for discussing:
  - The framework for distribution of revenues;
  - The financial situation of the local authorities; and
  - Efficiency measures

#### **6.4** Planning cycle timeframes that facilitate alignment

Country example: Colombia



- The National Development Plan uses a territorial approach
- Regional pacts for productivity and equity define development visions and strategic projects prioritized by the regions themselves to boost their economies and take advantage of their capabilities
  - Each regional pact has an accompanying road map for coordination of the approach to investment in the territory and of the efforts of the respective levels of government
  - All of the indicators and targets in the regional pacts are linked with one or more of the SDG targets; this enables alignment of national and subnational plans
