- Draft resolution on <u>promoting synergistic approaches to address the interlinked global crises</u> of climate change, biodiversity loss and pollution and support sustainable development, on behalf of Japan, co-sponsored by Fiji and Canada
- Draft resolution on <u>effective</u>, <u>inclusive</u> and <u>sustainable multilateral actions towards climate</u> justice, on behalf of Sri Lanka

- Draft resolution on <u>stepping up efforts for enhancing the circular economy transition</u> domestically, on behalf of the European Union and its Member States
- Draft resolution on <u>environmental aspects of minerals and metals</u>, on behalf of Switzerland and Senegal and co-sponsored by Armenia, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Gambia, Haiti, Sierra Leone, Chad
- Draft resolution on <u>environmental assistance and recovery in areas affected by armed conflicts</u>, on behalf of Ukraine
- Draft resolution on <u>sustainable lifestyles</u>, on behalf of India
- Draft resolution on <u>circularity of a resilient and low-carbon sugar cane agroindustry</u>, on behalf of Cuba
