



National workshop on the Framework for the Development of Environment Statistics (FDES 2013)

12 – 14 August 2024, Jakarta, Indonesia

CONCEPT NOTE

1. Introduction

The *National workshop on the Framework for the Development of Environment Statistics (FDES 2013)* will be organised in Jakarta, Indonesia over three days from 12 to 14 August 2024 in response to the official request received from BPS-Statistics Indonesia.

The national workshop is organized by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) in collaboration with BPS-Statistics Indonesia as part of the Statistics and Data Project “Resilient and agile National Statistical Systems to meet post-COVID-19 data needs to recover better” under the 14th tranche of the United Nations Development Account.

The main goal of the national workshop is to enhance the technical capacity of the National Statistical System (NSS) and other key stakeholders in determining the scope of environment statistics in the country, by bringing the various stakeholders together to provide hands-on training on the Framework for the Development of Environment Statistics (FDES 2013).

The target audience for the national workshop are national agencies that are responsible for the collection and dissemination of environment statistics and data, as well as for the development of policy documents in relevant areas. The participants could be from BPS - Statistics Indonesia, Ministry of Environment and Forestry, Ministry of Maritime Affairs and Fisheries, Ministry of Agriculture, Ministry of Energy and Mineral Resources, Meteorology, Climatology and Geophysics Agency, National Disaster Management Agency, as well as other relevant agencies.

2. Content of the workshop

The national workshop will focus on a detailed introduction of:

- the [Framework for the Development of Environment Statistics \(FDES 2013\)](#), which defines the scope of environment statistics, provides an organizing structure to guide the collection and compilation of environment statistics at the national level, and brings together data from the various relevant subject areas and sources; and
- the [Environment Statistics Self-Assessment Tool \(ESSAT\)](#), which aims to assist countries in both developing their environment statistics programmes and collecting their own data on the

environment, and to assess the state of environment statistics and the needs for their development at the national level consistent with the scope of the FDES 2013.

All participants will be invited to participate in an exercise on filling the ESSAT with national information within the working groups with the support of UNEP experts, covering the various components of the FDES 2013, such as Component 1 “Environmental Conditions and Quality”, Component 2 “Environmental Resources and their Use”, Component 3 “Residuals”, Component 4 “Extreme Events and Disasters”, Component 5 “Human Settlements and Environmental Health”, and Component 6 “Environmental Protection, Management and Engagement”. This exercise will provide an opportunity for all participants to introduce their work related to environment statistics and data.

The national workshop will be concluded with some recommendations and a summary of the lessons learned during the three days of joint work, as well as feedback from participants.

At the end of the workshops, the national experts will be better equipped to complete ESSAT with existing environment statistics in the country, identify data gaps and set the priority for the compilation of those statistics in the country.

3. Organisation of the Workshop

The national workshop will be held in Jakarta and will also provide an online listening opportunity with English-Indonesian interpretation from 8:00 – 16:00 on August 12-14, 2024. BPS-Indonesia will inform all nominated participants about the exact venue of the workshop closer to it.

In addition, towards the start of the workshop, all nominated participants will be invited by UNEP to complete short pre- and post-workshop surveys.
