1972

Stockholm Conference


UNEP is established in 1972 at the UN Conference on the Human Environment to monitor the state of the environment, inform policy making with science and coordinate responses to the world's environmental challenges. 2012

RIO+20, UNEP strengthened

At the UN Conference on Sustainable Development, UNEP's mandate is strengthened, and governance upgraded to universal membership through UNEA helping to define a new era of international environmental governance.

2022

UNEP@50, UNEP's contribution acknowledged. Political declaration at the UNEP@50 Special Session of UNEA acknowledged 50-year contribution of UNEP and further strengthened the mandate.






UNEP and the MEAs



How is UNEP funded?



CORE CONTRIBUTIONS

Gives flexibility to implement PoW as approved by all Member States

22% Environment Fund

The core fund, supports essential capacity needed for balanced and efficient delivery of programme approved by Member States (\$63.2M)

7% UN Regular Budget

Supports functions of UNEP Secretariat, including Governing Bodies, coordination in the UN system, and cooperation with global scientific communities (\$20M)

EARMARKED CONTRIBUTIONS

Earmarked for specific projects, themes or countries, enable expansion and replication of programme and results in more countries with more partners



How to strengthen UNEP's funding



Fund the Environment Fund at the level of the budget

approved by Member States. As of June 2024, we have pledges of 63M which is 69% of the annual target of \$91.07M

Contribute your full share - all UNEP

Member States (193) have the responsibility to fund UNEP. During this period of 2024, 53 Member States contributed to the Environment Fund, 30 of whom contributed their full share as per the indicative scale established by Member States (as at June 2024).

When core funding to the Environment
Fund is not possible, support the three
Thematic Funds. Currently almost 80
per cent of the funding received by
UNEP is earmarked. More effective
delivery of results needs more
flexibility in funding
