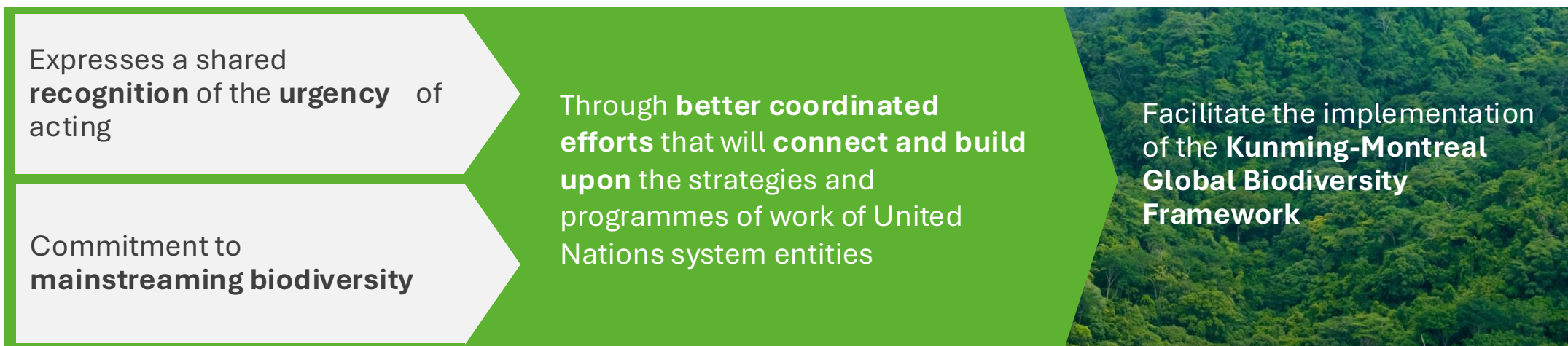

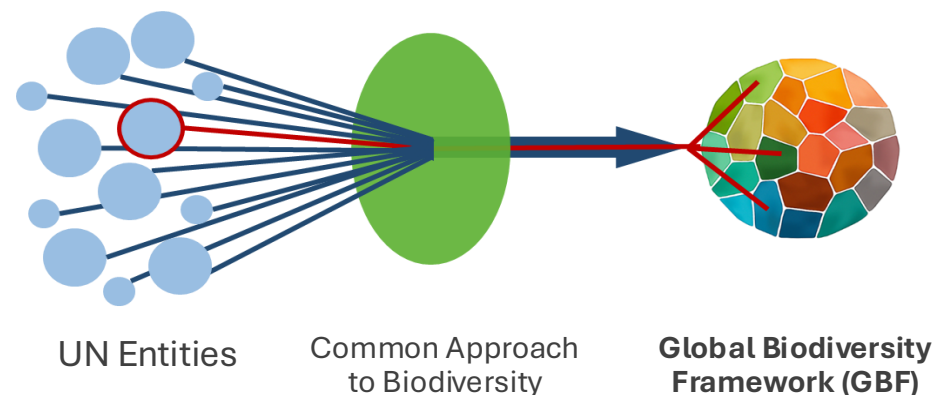


Integrating Biodiversity – IBC support

Through the Common Approach to **Biodiversity**, the United Nations system:



The Common Approaches provide a structure to organize collective action and joint delivery to mainstream biodiversity and pollution. Resulting in accelerated transformational change.





Issue-based Coalitions



- UN Development System reform resulted in establishment of Regional Collaborative Platform and Issue-based Coalitions (IBCs), which act as **regional task forces** to facilitate improved cooperation **between different UN agencies and their partners**.



- The UN System in Europe and Central Asia has set up **7 Issue-based Coalitions** and **2 other thematic groups** clustered around cross-cutting policy issues.

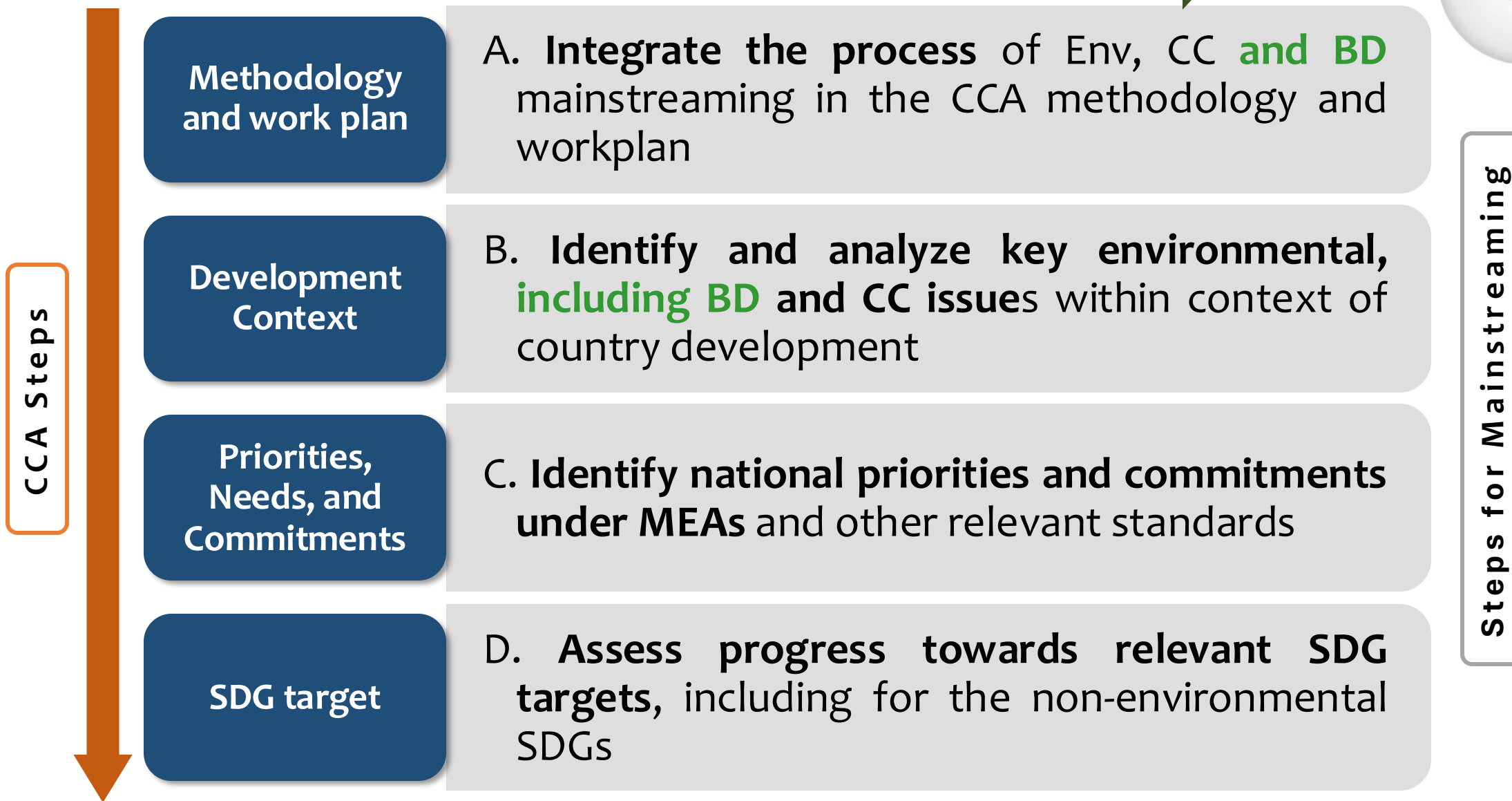

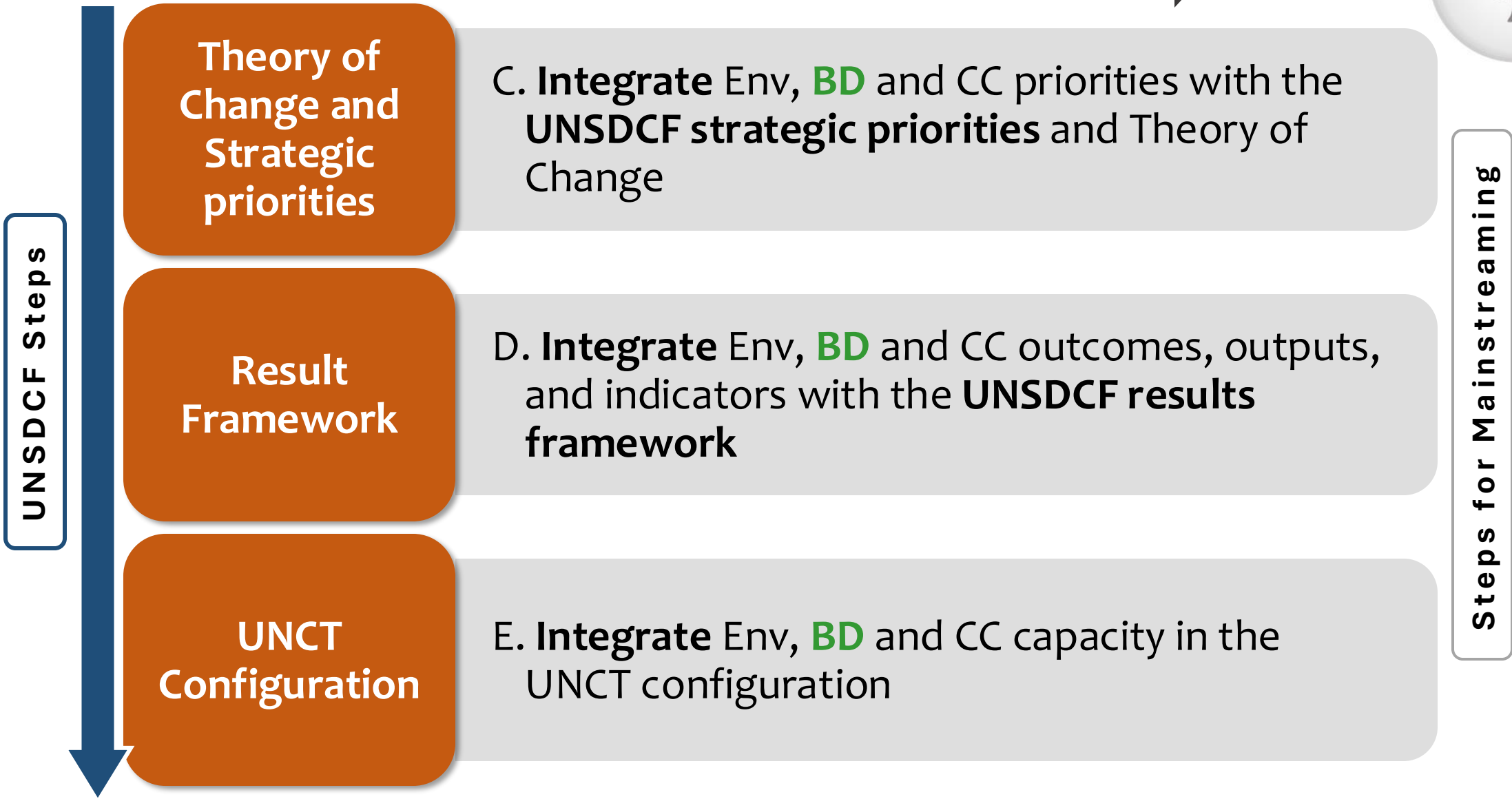

UNEP Digital Accelerator Lab

Offers the tools and resources to turn data into actionable insights, some examples of **tools/platforms;**

1. **STRATA**: Integrates satellite imagery with climate, environment, and security-related data to create hotspot maps.
2. **SCP-HAT**: Identify hotspots of unsustainable consumption and production practices.
3. **UN Biodiversity Lab**: Offers access to global spatial data on biodiversity.
4. **World Water Quality Hub**: This hub offers real-time data on water quality across the globe.

Common preliminary messages and actions

Recognize that nature and biodiversity are the **foundation for everything else** on the planet, providing essential ecosystem services and the basis of human wellbeing

There is a need to keep **generating evidence on the social, environmental and economic impact** of biodiversity conservation and sustainable use.

Biodiversity conservation can be seen as a costly alternative to development; however, it shall be seen as an **investment**

Biodiversity action shall follow **integrated and holistic approaches**, addressing the different drivers of biodiversity loss





Common preliminary messages and actions

Improve **multisectoral and multistakeholder participation** throughout the design and implementation of biodiversity-related policies and strategies, enabling continuous dialogue allowing the alignment of global, regional, national, and local agendas (i.e.: through Biodiversity Taskforce for the Western Balkans)

Learn from experience and **scale up** successful biodiversity actions in the region, as well as capitalize on regional expertise (i.e.: technical expertise, resource mobilization, cross-border action, etc.)

Guiding questions for discussion



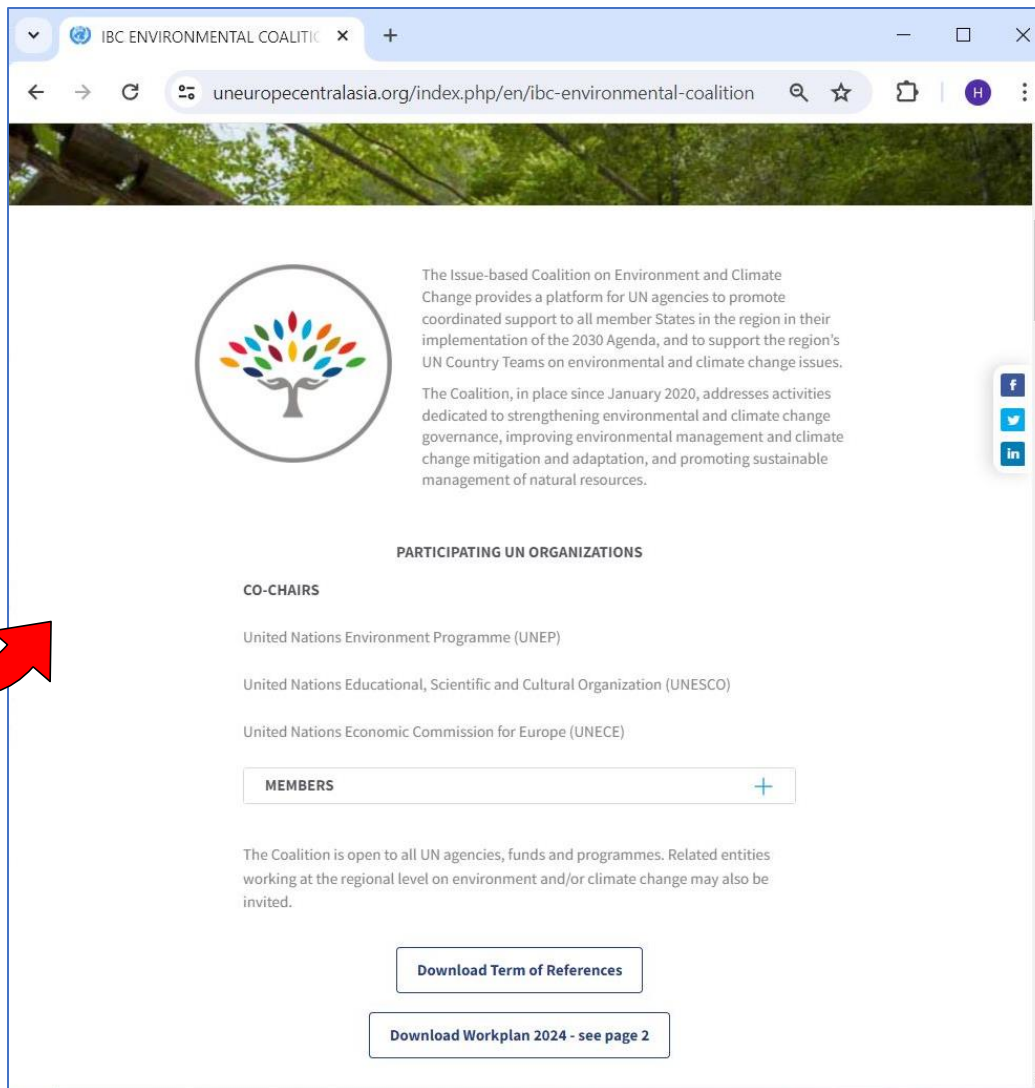
- What are the **main gaps and challenges** to strengthen biodiversity action in the Balkans at the **national and regional** level?
