

# UNEP IETC Global Dialogue Youth Day - Driving Change: Youth Leadership in the Circular Economy and Zero Waste

Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> February 2025

Waste management stands as one of the most urgent environmental challenges of our time, demanding solutions that span the entire lifecycle of products—from production and consumption to disposal and recovery. As a substantial segment of the global population, youth are pivotal in addressing this issue through innovation, advocacy, education, and action.

Co-organized with the <u>Children and Youth Major Group to UNEP</u>, the session titled *"Youth Leadership in Zero Waste: Global Approaches and Solutions"* seeks to amplify youth voices, highlight innovative practices, and promote intergenerational collaboration to achieve a zero-waste future.

Building on insights from earlier discussions and global governance efforts in waste and pollution management, participants will collaboratively draft the *Global Youth Declaration on the Circular Economy Model of Waste Management*. This declaration will identify youth priorities, enhance capacity, and integrate diverse perspectives from youth and youth-led organizations worldwide, serving as a roadmap for sustainable change.

The resulting policy paper will be shared with policymakers, practitioners, and experts, ensuring that youth-driven insights are incorporated into actionable strategies for a sustainable and circular economy.
