Background

- The Graduate Field Exercise (GFE) programme involves 34 participants from the university of Tokyo, Wangari Maathai Institute (WMI) graduate students and Professors.
- This is a 14 days exercise (15 -28th Feb, 2015) that will focus on environmental and livelihood issues in informal settlements in Nairobi.
- They have three study themes, i.e. (1) Solid waste management and ecosystem health of Nairobi River, (2) alternative energy sources for the urban poor and (3) urban livelihoods and assets in the informal settlements.

Interactive Discussions

- **Mahesh Pradhan, Chief, Environmental Education and Training Unit, UNEP**, welcomed the and emphasized the importance of scholars in building environmental capacity and leadership
- **Prof. David Mungai, University of Nairobi/WMI**, introduced the GFE programme participants and the objective of the exercise.
- **Prof. Takashi Mino, university of Tokyo** emphasized on importance of the exercise in achievement of sustainable development.
- **Grace Lubaale, Strategic Advisor, UN-HABITAT**, affirmed in his presentation that important assets of the poor vary with time depending on its monetary and intrinsic value.
- **Henry Ndede, UNEP- Kenya Country Programme**, highlighted solid waste management in informal settlement is vital in enhancing the capacity of city dwellers as they emit 60% of the total wastes.
- **Janice Muthui and Wakina Mutembei, The community Cooker Foundation**, emphasized on their presentation on importance of taking up alternative energy initiatives that will bring change and beneficial to the society, economy, health and environment.
