


PROCESS

- The drafting of the report aims to employ best practices from existing multilateral instruments, and tailor them to address the specificities of plastic pollution across the lifecycle.
- Review of literature published in academic and policy outlets
- Organization of the two technical workshops:
- 1) Reykjavik, Iceland (September 2019)
- 2) Copenhagen, Denmark (January 2020)



MOVING TOWARDS A LIFE CYCLE APPROACH



The report discusses options for a global agreement, but this presentation focuses on one option that in our view best accommodates the above concepts

Helps to prioritize plastic pollution at the national level and leverage financial resources




Enables coordination of actions and tracking of global progress

THE LIFE CYCLE OF PLASTICS


















