The official program began at 10:00am where official statements were given out by DEPC's senior chemical/ozone officer and the guest speaker of the day Mrs. Esline Garaebiti (DG, Climate change). Introductory videos were viewed along with follow up quizzes were asked to everyone. Awareness sessions from the departments of Energy, Climate change and Environment was also an important part of the event as students from various high schools were invited. Presentations of prizes were given out to the winning individuals who took part in the ozone video and world clean up photo competition. A popular regional artist Mr. Renold was there to keep everyone entertained.

Lunch was served to all the participants and inflatable water bottles were distributed to the participants to mark that day's event. Students from Pacific Vocational Training Centre presented a short display on best handling of flammable refrigerants to the public.

Display booths were set out by different organizations who took part in the event, advocating for the two themes of the day "Ozone for Life: 35 years of Ozone Layer Protection" and "KLIN VANUATU: RISPEKTEM MAN, RISPEKTEM ENVAEROMEN".

It was very encouraging to see the Mamas Life team who also took part in the booth displays to be part of the consultation on diaper ban to highlight some of their products for the public to see. Environment champion t-shirts and certificates were given to registered licensed waste operators in Port Vila to recognize their contributions towards

keeping Port-Vila's environment clean and to keep their support in continuing to assist the department, Port Vila city council and Shefa province in which ever environment activity's their doing.

There is a huge difference about this year's celebration compared to last year as a result of everyone's pro-active participation in the preparation and event happenings itself. Advertisement on press, social media outlets and posters did really help a lot in getting children and even mothers from different areas to participate in the event which shows that Vanuatu is moving one-step forward in caring to reduce wastes and chemicals in our environment to also contribute in the protection of the ozone layer.
