The World is Burning: Be a Firefighter

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Unprecedented and historic forest fires have been raging across the world in the previous weeks. Flames have been engulfing forests from California to Siberia and Indonesia associated with historic records of heatwaves caused by climate change. Humans, animals and ecosystems have perished. Wildfires emit between 5 and 30 tonnes of carbon per hectare reaching to almost 3600 tonnes of carbon a year.

Are we watching? Are we listening? Are we taking action? COP26 is just a few weeks ahead. Let's all be firefighters, not only fighting raging forest fires, but also in cooling our atmosphere by committing in our own institutions' climate action strategies, and calling upon our governments to make bold and meaningful commitments.

Join the rising interfaith movement on climate change and be an active agent.

The document highlights critical challenges to current-day environmental governance, such as the impacts of human activities on biodiversity, the rise of climate change impacts and consequent growth in inequalities, while addressing a way forward where Faith and conservation are aligned.

In August, <u>Al-Mizan: A Covenant for the Earth</u> entered a Consultative Process with more than 250 Islamic Institutions, Scholars, and Faith-based Organisations.

The Consultative Process will close on 20 September 2021 and aims to solicit feedback from a broad range of Islamic organisations, scholars, and traditions seeking to mobilise faithbased communities to take action in fighting the triple planetary crisis of climate change, ecosystems degradation, and pollution.



The Covenant is a collective effort by the <u>Core and Scholars Drafting Teams</u> and the United Nations Environment Programme <u>Faith for Earth Initiative</u>.

In 2020, Faith for Earth partnered with the <u>Parliament of World Religions</u>, <u>Bhumi Global</u>, and the <u>United Religions Initiative</u> to commemorate the 5th anniversary of the launch of the SDGs by launching the <u>Progress & Outlook Report: Faith Action on the UN Sustainable Development Goals</u>.

In 2021, the <u>Yale Forum on Religion and Ecology</u> joined this partnership and produced a database where all faith-based environment-related projects & campaigns by faith actors can be recorded, facilitating the development of annual reports which present global, regional, and local efforts.
