Asia Pacific GPP Network objectives (I)

Purpose of the Network

- The Asia Pacific GPP Network project aims to strengthen the capacity of national governments in implementing Green Public Procurement via the establishment of a collaborative regional network.
- The Network is **jointly organized and led by <u>KEITI</u> and <u>UNEP</u> (Asia Pacific Bangkok Office and the Sustainable Public Procurement team).**
- It is **supported by the <u>South Asia Co-operative Environment Programme</u> (SACEP)** and contributes to the objectives of the <u>One Planet SPP Programme</u>.
- The Network aims at synergizing its work with the activities of the <u>International Green Purchasing</u>
 <u>Network</u> and <u>other initiatives</u> supportive of green public procurement.
- Building on the former *Asia Pacific GPP and Eco-labelling Network* (2013-2016), the new network engages a broader spectrum of key stakeholders to ensure a broad dialogue and cooperation.

Asia Pacific GPP Network objectives (II)

Objectives of the Network

The network hopes to achieve **increased capacity** of partner countries to **stimulate markets for eco-friendly products and services**, and to implement <u>SDG target 12.7</u> (*Promote public procurement practices that are sustainable, in accordance with national policies and priorities*).

- Serve as an information platform for Green Public Procurement among the relevant governments, public organisations and stakeholders in the Asia Pacific region.
- Promote awareness and build capacity of policy makers.
- Support and amplify the work of the One Planet SPP Programme in the Asia Pacific region.
- Identify concrete needs of the countries for the introduction and implementation of Green Public Procurement.

Asia Pacific GPP Network objectives (III)

The Network comprises two different levels of membership:

- A "core group" comprised of representatives from national government/government agencies (Ministry of Finance, Industry, Planning, Environment etc.) in charge of designing and implementing GPP policies;
- A "second-level" group ("Larger Network") encompassing various GPP stakeholders ranging across academia, cities and provinces, national/multilateral banks and financial institutions, NGOs and public interest advocates, IGOs, the private sector, etc.


