مقدمة

عغطي هذا التقرير الأنشطة والنتائج المنفذة في الفترة من كانون الثاني/يناير 2010 حتى أيلول/سبتمبر 2011.

2 يتألف التقرير المرحلي من جزء سردي يؤكد على نتائج ونتائج منتصف المدة والتقدم المتحقق خلال الفترة قيد الاستعراض تحت 6 موضوعات ويوفر معلومات تفصيلية بشأن المسائل القانونية والمالية والإدارية والسياسية. ويقدم المرفق الأول معلومات تفصيلية عن التقدم المحرز، وكلما كان ملائما، عن المسائل محل نظر لكل نتيجة، فيما يتعلق بالتخطيط والتنفيذ في المستقبل.

3 التقدم المحرز والانجازات الرئيسة:

- الانتهاء من الخطوتين 3 و4 من خريطة طريق المنهج الإيكولوجي الذي وافقت عليه الأطراف المتعاقدة في الميرية، 2008، والاتفاق على اجتماع الخبراء المعينين من الحكومات وعلى قائمة 11 هدفا إيكولوجيا و 52 مؤشرا لتكامل مسائل التلوث والتنوع البيولوجي وإدارة السواحل من خلال عملية تتضمن جميع مكونات خطة عمل البحر المتوسط بقيادة خبراء من الأطراف المتعاقدة؛
- الانتهاء من النظام الإيكولوجي القائم على تقرير تقييم البحر المتوسط الذي استعرضه نظراء من GESAMP. وللبناء على هذا العمل، يجرى الإعداد لتقرير حالة البيئة لفترة السنتين للبدء فيه في الاجتماع السابع عشر للأطراف المتعاقدة. وفي هذه العملية، يجرى إنشاء تأزر وثيق مع خطط لتنفيذ التوجيه البحري الاستراتيجي للاتحاد الأوروبي في البحر المتوسط؛
- عقد الاجتماع الرابع عشر للجنة البحر المتوسط للتنمية المستدامة مع تركيز على الاقتصاد الأخضر والترتيبات المؤسسية ومقترح بالمساهمة في ريو+20 وإجراء تحسينات على مشروع إطار تغير المناخ وتوصيات لدعم لجنة البحر المتوسط للتنمية المستدامة؛
- الإنتهاء من مشروع برنامج عمل الفترة من 2012 إلى 2013، متمشيا بالكامل مع الاستراتيجية الخمسية، مع الأخذ في الاعتبار التقدم المحرز والقضايا الآخذه في الظهور من خلال عملية استشارية موجزة في ورقة حسن الإدارة ومناقشتها في اجتماعات جهات الاتصال لمراكز الأنشطة الإقليمية التي يجرى تحديثها حاليا تمشيا مع التوجيه الوارد من الاجتماع الموسع للمكتب الذي عقد في أثينا في الفترة 3-5 تشرين الأول/أكتوبر 2011؛
- مكون اجتماعات جهات الاتصال المعقودة التي قدمت توجيها مهما للانتهاء من برنامج العمل وتوصيات السياسية لتنظر في الاجتماع السابع عشر للأطراف المتعاقدة، بما في ذلك مقررات ستقدم إلى الأطراف المتعاقدة؛

- الانتهاء من تقييم تنفيذ استراتيجية البحر المتوسط للتنمية المستدامة للفترة 2005-2010 واستعراض التوصيات والموافقة عليها في الاجتماع الرابع عشر للجنة البحر المتوسط للتنمية المستدامة. وستتناول التوصيات استراتيجية البحر المتوسط للتنمية المستدامة للفترة 2015-2025 في فترة السنتين القادمة وستتناول التوصيات المقدمة في التقييم؛
- تنفيذ استراتيجية البحر المتوسط للتنمية المستدامة المبلغ عنها. تم تحليل التقدم المحرز لعدد 34 أولوية لمؤشرات استراتيجية البحر المتوسط للتنمية المستدامة في تقييم الاستراتيجية والانتهاء من تقرير تحديث عام 2011 بشأن استراتيجية البحر المتوسط للتنمية المستدامة؛ 2
- اتفاقات البلد المضيف. وضعت الأمانة نموذجا مشتركا لمراكز الأنشطة الإقليمية المضيفة من قبل البلدان المعنية توجز الولاية والمسؤوليات وحسن الإدارة لكل مركز. ووافقت الأطراف المتعاقدة على المشروع بعد مناقشة وتقاسم فيها الأطراف المعنية في اجتماع مكتب الأطراف المعقود في الرباط في آيار/مايو 2010 وفي اجتماع المكتب الموسع للأطراف في اتفاقية برشلونة الذي عقد في أثينا في الفترة 3-5 تشرين الأول/أكتوبر 2011 والذي رحب بالتقدم الذي أحرزته الأطراف المتعاقدة في وضع اتفاقات البلد المضيف لمراكز الأنشطة الإقليمية وشجعها على الانتهاء من هذه الاتفاقات في أسرع وقت ممكن؛
- إعداد خطط إقليمية واعتمادها: بما في ذلك الموافقة على خطط الطلب على الأكسجين الحيوي والزئبق والملوثات العضوية المداومة في آيار/مايو 2011، والانتهاء من ورقة سياسية وإطار استراتيجي للفضلات البحرية، التي ستكون أساس خطة عمل بشأن الفضلات البحرية لتعتمدها الأطراف المتعاقدة. واعتمدت جهات الاتصال استراتيجية البحر المتوسط بشأن إدارة مياه صابورة السفن³، بما في ذلك خطة عملها وجدول زمني في آيار/مايو وستقدم إلى الأطراف المتعاقدة؛
- بدأ العمل بشأن إعداد تقييم مخاطر وإطار إدارة تخزين ثاني أكسيد الكربون في التربة التحتية للتكوينات الجيولوجية في حوض البحر المتوسط. ويجرى تنفيذ العمل في إطار مدبول بالمساهمة الكريمة من حكومة إسبانيا؟
- وبناء على مقرر المكتب الحادى والسبعين، تم إعداد خطة عمل لتنفيذ بروتوكول الإدارة المتكاملة للمناطق الساحلية بين وحدة التنسيق ومركز الأنشطة الإقليمية لبرنامج الأعمال ذات الأولوية ويتوقع الانتهاء منها في تشرين الأول/اكتوبر 2011. وبالاضافة إلى ذلك، تم أيضا إعداد مشروع استمارة إبلاغ لبروتوكول الإدارة المتكاملة للمناطق الساحلية تحت توجيه وحدة التنسيق؛
- تحليل وتفسير بروتوكول الإدارة المتكاملة للمناطق الساحلية، تم العمل بشأن المادة 8 المتعلقة بالمنطقة العقبة. وباعتبارها من أكثر المواد مدعاة للنقد، تم تفسيرها لغرض تحليل الأثر على بروتوكول الإدارة المتكاملة للمناطق الساحلية بشأن وثائق التخطيط المكانى للجبل الأسود؛

- يجرى القيام بتحليل النظام القانوني لكرواتيا فيما يتعلق ببروتوكول الإدارة المتكاملة للمناطق الساحلية ومن المخطط أن يكون مثالا جيدا تحتذي به بلدان أخرى، خاصة المؤهلة لمشروع شراكة البحر المتوسط، وذلك للامتثال للبروتوكول. وستحدد الثغرات في النظام القانوني واقتراح الحلول؛
- يجرى دعم الإدارة المالية واتخاذ التدابير التصحيحية للتصدى للافراط في الميزانية والعجز المالي. ويجرى إعداد مشروع ميزانية قائم على أساس نسق الميزانية الجديد وسيناريوهات خفض التكاليف كما قرر المكتب الموسع الذي عقد في أثينا في 6 تشرين الأول/أكتوبر 2011 ؛
- تم صياغة مقترحات مشروعات ومفاهيم جديدة وقدمت إلى مرفق البيئة العالمية ومصادر تمويل أخرى لتحقيق نتائج برنامج العمل الاستراتيجي الخماسي فيما يتعلق بمنهج النظام الإيكولوجي والتكيف مع تغير المناخ ودعم شبكة المناطق ذات الأهمية البيئية للبحر المتوسط؛ ومن أجل تحسين تنسيق حشد الموارد في المستقبل، يجرى الاعداد لاستراتيجية حشد الموارد لتقديمها إلى اجتماع جهات الاتصال القادم؛
- يجرى انتهاء السنة الثانية من تنفيذ مشروع شراكة البحر المتوسط مع تنسيق اجتماعين لفريق التنسيق ولجنة التوجيه على التوالي، مع موقع ويب⁴ منقح ونشر التقرير السنوي لعام 2010؛
- تم الانتهاء من استراتيجية الاتصالات وخطة العمل لبرنامج الأمم المتحدة للبيئة/خطة عمل البحر المتوسط للفترة 2012-2012 لتقديمها إلى الاجتماع السابع عشر للأطراف المتعاقدة والتي قامت على أساس التقييم والتوصيات التي قدمت في عام 2010 ووافق عليها اجتماع المكتب (UNEP/BUR/70/5) في الرباط، المغرب، آيار/مايو 2010؛
- تطوير وتنفيذ نظام معلومات البحر المتوسط بشأن البيئة والتنمية المستدامة⁵ إلكترونيا منذ أيلول/سبتمبر 2010 الذي يتيح وصول المستعمل إلى 2000 12 دليل بيانات بشأن المسائل الرئيسة وموضوعات التنمية المستدامة في البحر المتوسط؛
- الاتصالات المحسنة بشأن الأنشطة: موقع ويب جديد لمركز الأنشطة الإقليمي للمناطق المتمتعة بحماية خاصة ونشر أخبار عاجلة؛ مبادئ توجيهية تصويرية جديدة لآلية غرفة مقاصة بشأن التنوع البيولوجي البحري والساحلي وكذلك تحسين السطح البيني لنظام المعلومات الجغرافية للبحر المتوسط؛
- معرفة إقليمية متقدمة عن التنوع البيولوجي، بما في ذلك مساعدة البلدان على إنشاء شبكات رصد للموائل الرئيسة؛ إعداد مبادئ توجيهية؛ وضع جرد للأنواع البحرية غير الأصلية في 31 موقعا على سواحل ألبانيا والجبل السود؛ تنظيم ندوتين دون إقليمية/إقليمية لتطبيق خطط عمل تتعلق بالأنواع؛
- تقرير "حالة الوضع في البحر المتوسط" من أجل احتياجات محددة لبلدان جنوب البحر المتوسط مع تركيز على أولويات آفاق عام 2020، أعدت لتنفيذ "نحو نظام معلومات بيئية متقاسمة"؛ 6

- طبقا لإعلان مراكش، تم وضع مشروع تكيف إقليمي لإطار تغير المناخ وتم استعراضه في الاجتماع الرابع عشر للجنة البحر المتوسط للتنمية المستدامة. وسيجرى تنفيذ العديد من الأعمال ذات الأولوية التي

حددت إبتداء من عام 2012 مع أموال اضافية، تحت إشراف مشروع "تكامل التقلبية المناخية والتغير في الاستراتيجيات الوطنية لتنفيذ بروتوكول الإدارة المتكاملة للمناطق الساحلية في البحر المتوسط". وتقترح وحدة التنسيق وضع إطار آخر للانتهاء منه خلال فترة السنتين القادمة؛

- سيجرى وضع سياسة تقييم البيئة البحرية والساحلية في فترة السنتين القادمة، في إطار منهج النظام الإيكولوجي. وسوف يساهم تقييم المنهج الإيكولوجي والاتفاق على الأهداف الإيكولوجية والمؤشرات بشكل كبير في هذه العملية بالتزامن مع تقييم استراتيجية البحر المتوسط للتنمية المستدامة التي من المتصور وضع منهج متكامل للتنفيذ والإبلاغ عن المنهج الإيكولوجي ووضع استراتيجية البحر المتوسط للتنمية المستدامة في فترة السنتين القادمة.
- 5 ينبغي أن تساهم الفترة القادمة في تعزيز العمل الذي تم والنتائج التي تحققت والانتهاء من التخطيط والبرمجة لفترة السنتين القادمة مع تركيز خاص على تنفيذ الاجتماع السابع عشر الأطراف المتعاقدة بشكل جوهري.
- وبالاضافة إلى ذلك، تود الأمانة أن تقدم للمكتب بعض المعلومات التفصيلية عن المسائل القانونية والسياسية
 حيث يطلب من أعضاء المكتب التوجيه والمشورة.

1-1 المسائل القانونية

1-1-1 حالة التصديق وبدء النفاذ

7 منذ آخر اجتماع للمكتب، صدق المغرب على بروتوكول المنع وحالات الطوارئ الجديد وبدء نفاذ كل من بروتوكول عرض البحر والإدارة المتكاملة للمناطق الساحلية ويرجع ذلك إلى تصديق حكومة سوريا. وطبقا لآخر تحديث بشأن حالة التصديق الذي تلقته إسبانيا بصفتها الدولة المودع لديها اتفاقية برشلونة وبروتوكولاتها، وعقب طلب من الأمانة، فإن الحالة كما يلى:

قبل 21 طرفا متعاقدا التعديلات على اتفاقية عام 1995،

قبل 15 طرفا متعاقدا التعديلات على بروتوكول الإلقاء لعام 1995؛

صدق 13 طرفا متعاقدا على بروتوكول المنع وحالات الطوارئ الجديد لعام 2002؛

قبل 17 طرفا متعاقدا التعديلات على بروتوكول المصادر البرية لعام 1996؛

صدق 18 طرفا متعاقدا على بروتوكول المناطق المتمتعة بحماية خاصة والتنوع البيولوجي لعام 1995

صدقت 7 أطراف متعاقدة على بروتوكول النفايات الخطرة لعام 1996؛

صدقت 6 أطراف متعاقدة على بروتوكول عرض البحر لعام 1994؛

صدقت 6 أطراف متعاقدة على بروتوكول الإدارة المتكاملة للمناطق الساحلية لعام .2008

8 ترد المعلومات التفصيلية بشأن حالة التصديق وبدء النفاذ في المرفق الثاني بهذا التقرير.

9 إن بدء نفاذ الصكوك القانونية لخطة عمل البحر المتوسط في تقدم مستمر. ومع ذلك، ينبغي بذل جهود اضافية بغرض بدء نفاذ جميع الصكوك القانونية لخطة عمل البحر المتوسط على جميع الأطراف المتعاقدة. وفي هذا السياق،

يشجع المكتب الأطراف المتعاقدة التي لم تصدق على الصكوك القانونية لخطة عمل البحر المتوسط أن تفعل ذلك بأسرع وقت ممكن وخاصة بروتوكول الإلقاء الذي ينتظر قبولا واحدا على تعديلات عام 1995.

1-1-2 الإبلاغ عن التنفيذ

10 طبقا للمقرر 4/19 بشأن الإبلاغ ومؤشرات الفاعلية، يتعين على الأطراف المتعاقدة تقديم تقارير عن التدابير المتخذة لتنفيذ الاتفاقية وبروتوكولاتها عن فترة السنتين 2008-2009 في أسرع وقت ممكن لتترك الوقت الضروري للأمانة لتقييم المعلومات المقدمة وإعداد تقرير تقييم إقليمي لتنظر فيه اجتماعات لجنة الامتثال والأطراف المتعاقدة. وفي هذا الصدد، أرسلت الأمانة رسالة في تموز/يولية 2011 إلى جميع جهات اتصال خطة عمل البحر المتوسط كمذكر لتقديم التقارير الوطنية قبل 15 أيلول/سبتمبر 2011.

11 وعقب المناقشات ومقررات آخر اجتماع للمكتب، وما تبعه من رسائل الأمانة، اصبحت استمارة الإبلاغ متاحة الكترونيا منذ تشرين الثاني/نوفمبر 2010 مما يسمح للأطراف المتعاقدة بتحميل تقاريرها بالانجليزية و/أو بالفرنسية بحلول نهاية عام 2010.

12 قدمت الأطراف المتعاقدة 15 تقريرا عن التدابير التي اتخذتها لتنفيذ اتفاقية برشلونة للفترة 2008-2009 امتثالا لإلتزامات الإبلاغ بناء على المادة 26 من اتفاقية برشلونة.

مشروع توصية

يدعو المكتب إلى الترحيب بالتصديق وبدء نفاذ بروتوكولي الإدارة المتكاملة للمناطق الساحلية وعرض البحر مع الأخذ في الاعتبار أن هذه صكوك قانونية متقدمة وهي رائدة ومتفردة في البحر المتوسط والمستويات العالمية وتوفر محفلا ممتازا لإدارة بيئية محسنة في المنطقة. وتناشد الأطراف المتعاقدة التصديق على جميع الصكوك القانونية مع تركيز خاص على اعتماد التعديلات على بروتوكول الإلقاء.

ويدعو المكتب إلى مناشدة الأطراف المتعاقدة تقديم تقاريرها، دون تأخير، عن التدابير المتخذة خلال فترة السنتين 2008-2009 لتنفيذ الاتفاقية وبروتوكولاتها باعتبار ذلك التزام رئيسي بناء على اتفاقية برشلونة،

يتطلع المكتب إلى تقرير التقييم للأمانة عن حالة تنفيذ الاتفاقية وبروتوكولاتها لتنظر فيها لجنة الامتثال واجتماع الأطراف المتعاقدة في عام 2011 كما ورد في آليات وإجراءات الامتثال بناء على اتفاقية برشلونة وبرتوكولاتها.

1-1-3 لجنة الامتثال

13 عقدت لجنة الامتثال اجتماعها الرابع في أثينا في الفترة 5-6 تموز/يولية 2011 ترأسه السيد Larbi SBAI الرئيس الجديد المنتخب من قبل لجنة الامتثال. وفيما يتعلق بتقديم التقارير، وضعت اللجنة تقييما للالتزام بالإبلاغ الذي فرضته المادة 26 من اتفاقية برشلونة. وفي هذا الصدد، أشارت إلى أن الفشل المتكرر في الامتثال لهذا الالتزام هو حالة متوقعة لعدم الامتثال وطلبت من الأطراف المتعاقدة بشكل ملح تقديم تقاريرها الوطنية لفترة السنتين 2008-2009 دون تأخير. وحتى 14 تشرين الأول/أكتوبر قدم 15 طرفا متعاقدا تقاريرهم إلى الأمانة. ومن المخطط عقد الاجتماع الخامس للجنة الامتثال في الفترة 10-11 تشرين الثاني/نوفمبر 2011 في أثينا.

1-1-4 المسؤولية والتعويض

14 طبقا للمقرر 3/19 للاجتماع السادس عشر للأطراف المتعاقدة، عهد إلى الفريق العامل من الخبراء القانونيين والتقنيين وضع تقييم لتنفيذ المبادئ التوجيهية لتحديد المسؤولية والتعويض عن الأضرار الناجمة عن تلوث البيئة البحرية

في البحر المتوسط. وفي هذا الصدد، حدد الفريق العامل اجتماعه الخامس في الفترة 8-9 كانون الأول/ديسمبر 2011 في أثينا وذلك لتحليل ردود الأطراف المتعاقدة في التقرير لتطبيق هذه المبادئ التوجيهية وخاصة على بروتوكول عرض البحر. وفي هذا الصدد، ستعرض دراسة عن تقييم تنفيذ نظام المسؤولية والتعويض، المنصوص عليه في المادة 27 من بروتوكول عرض البحر، في إطار نظم المسؤولية والتعويض ذات العلاقة سارية المفعول. وسيقدم تقرير عن أنشطة الفريق العامل كوثيقة إعلامية إلى الفريق العامل بشأن مسائل عرض البحرالتي ستوضع بناء على مقرر بشأن تنفيذ بروتوكول عرض البحر في الاجتماع السابع عشر لمؤتمر الأطراف المتعاقدة. وبالاضافة إلى ذلك، يتوقع برنامج العمل عقد اجتماع واحد اضافي خلال فترة السنتين القادمة 2012-2013 للسماح للفريق العامل بالسعي لتنفيذ برنامج عمله.

2-1 التعاون والشراكات

15 خلال الفترة قيد الاستعراض، بدأ برنامج الأمم المتحدة للبيئة/خطة عمل البحر المتوسط مبادرات لدعم الشراكات مع مرفق البيئة العالمية وكذلك مع برامج وشعب الأمم المتحدة لإقامة تآزرات ودعم التماسك وأثر سياساتنا وأعمالنا على القضايا المشتركة.
