

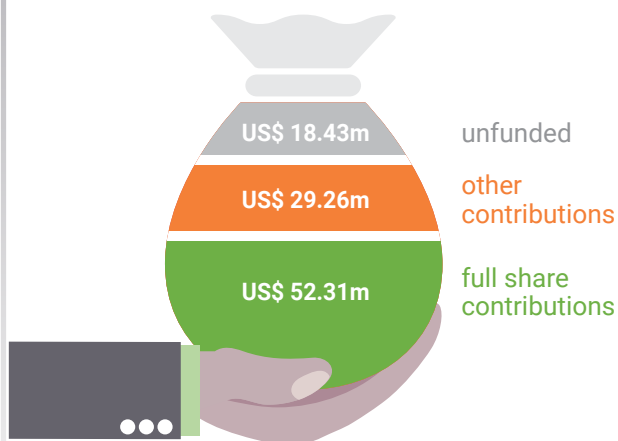

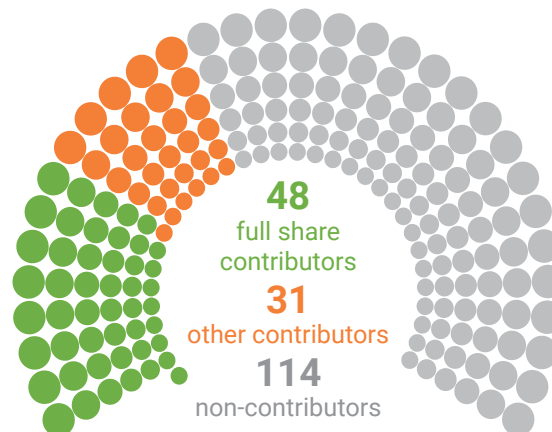

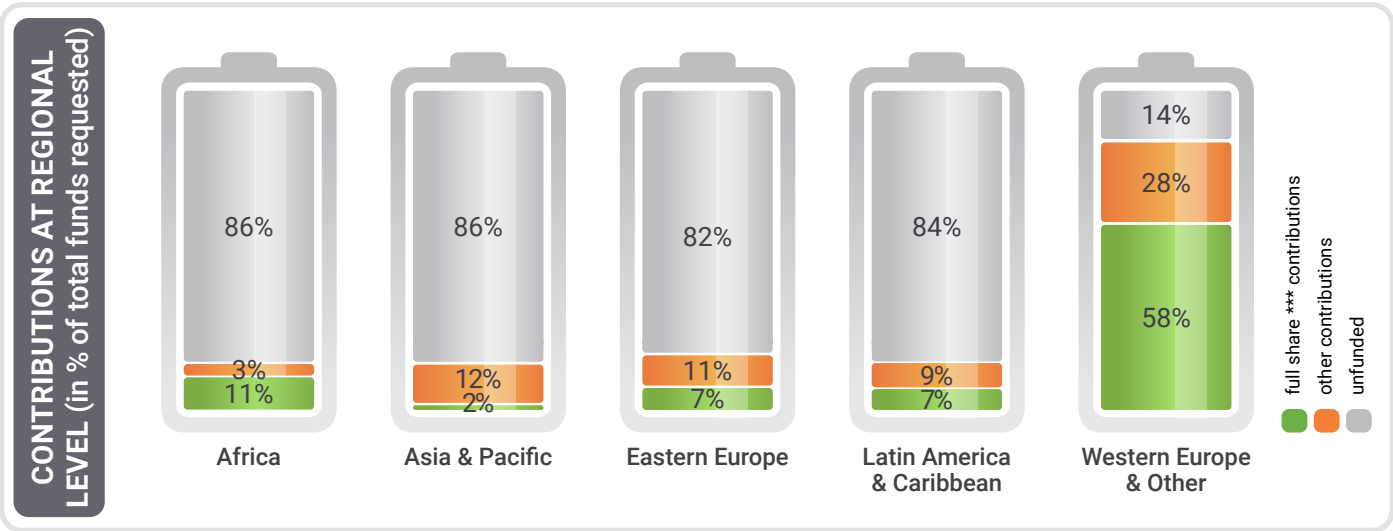

As climate impacts intensify globally, the **Emissions Gap Report 2024: No more hot air ... please!** finds that nations must deliver dramatically stronger ambition and action – or the Paris Agreement’s 1.5°C goal will be gone within a few years. The report, financed by the Environment Fund, is the 15th edition in a series that brings together many of the world’s top climate scientists to look at future trends in greenhouse gas emissions and provide potential solutions to the challenge of global warming.
